Application Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's study. It is also helpful when you are able to discuss your answers with others.

- 1. Read **2 Peter 2:1-3** and **2 Corinthians 11:13-15** God clearly wants us to be vigilant about error and discerning about the truth. What are some of the common reasons Christians deviate from the truth that God has clearly revealed in his word?
- 2. Read **2 Peter 3:15-18**. What are some of the specific hazards associated with believing what is not true; in other words, what are the implications of "losing your stability" as it is put in this passage?
- 3. Read **Hebrews 1:1-3** and **Mark 9:2-8**. Along with the human author of the Pentateuch and the figurehead of the Old Testament prophets, the authoritative Christ is presented in Mark 9 as the culmination of God's communication. How would you describe your need to learn more diligently of the truth regarding Jesus Christ?
- 4. Read **2 Timothy 2:14-19**. There is some "learning" that is characterized by nothing but fruitless debate, while the "work" that God is calling us to in the "word of truth" results in increasing godliness. What you can do in your own study to make sure that your learning consistently results in increasing Christlikeness?
