Prologue – vv.1-3

- The amazing turn of events from slavery to marriage treatise
- The scattered worship of Jehovah
- Solomon's love for God, obedience to his father's precepts

Solomon Receives Wisdom - vv.3-15

- The context of worship (at Gibeon, the place of the tabernacle); royal sacrifices
- The LORD appears in a dream asks Solomon what he desires
- 1.) His realization of *God's mercies* (to David in the past and present)
- 2.) His *humility* (as a little child)
- 3.) His sense of having an **overwhelming task** (too great and numerous)
- 4.) His request for understanding/wisdom/discernment more than mere doing of laws
- 5.) His *ultimate desire* for God's glory they are His people
- This pleased God, and He responds by affirming and granting even more than Solomon requested
- Solomon will be unique among all the kings
- He returns to the Ark of the Covenant in Jerusalem, and there offers sacrifices and gives a feast

An Example of Solomon's Wisdom - vv.16-28

- Imagine the scene appearance of two prostitutes concern for justice for all
- Only the two living together no other witnesses
- The principle was in the law, but this specific case not available
- Something more than command was needed, but how to discern in wisdom the truth
- Appeals to the *love of a mother* contrast between the two, *common grace* in sinners
- God gives Solomon wisdom, and his fame for wisdom spreads

What does this have to do with us? We are not kings with such a task

Call to seek wisdom above all Prov4:7 16:16

Seek wisdom in the Lord Jesus Christ

- Mt13:54 where did He get this wisdom - Lk11:31 greater than Solomon - 1Cor1:30 wisdom of God

We need these same 5 things (above)

- In the church, in the workplace, in the home, parenting
- <u>James 1:5-7</u> request for wisdom for your further study <u>3:13-18</u>
