## I. Introduction – providence, lovingkindness and redemption.

## II. Favor needed. v. 1-2

- A. Introducing Boaz. v. 1
- B. Ruth seeks permission from Naomi to go out gleaning. v. 2
  - 1. Ruth takes initiative and honors her mother-in-law. 1:16-17
  - 2. Ruth knows God's Law which reflects His care for widows. <u>Ps. 68:5 Lev. 19:9-10 23:22 Dt. 24:19-22 25:5-6 Ex. 22:22</u>
- C. What can we learn from God's Word about helping the poor?
  - 1. Because we live in a fallen world, poverty will never be eliminated. Mt. 26:11
  - 2. What are the causes of poverty? 1:1-5 Prov. 10:4-5 6:6-11 24:30-34
  - 3. God's law reflects His wisdom.
    - a. The deserving poor obtain food in proportion to their effort.
    - b. That which otherwise would have been wasted is utilized.
    - c. The community participates in helping the poor and provides accountability.
  - 4. What does the New Testament teach about helping the poor? 1 Jo. 3:17 Js. 1:27
    - a. The family is the first line of defense. 1 Tim. 5:4
    - b. Then the church offers help. Ga. 2:10 2 Co. 8-9 Acts 2:45 4:34-35
    - c. Those who refuse to work should not receive assistance. 2 Thess. 3:10-12
  - 5. Do we wisely care for our poor? 2 Thess. 3:7-13
  - 6. The gospel transforms the thief into a worker who reflects God's lovingkindness by sharing with those in need. Eph. 4:28 John 13:35 2 Cor. 8:9
  - 7. There should be no needy among God's people. Acts 4:34 Deut. 15:4
- D. Ruth still needs someone to look upon her favorably. v. 9,15 Isa. 17:4ff

## III. Favor supplied. v. 3-16

- A. Ruth by chance happens upon the field of Boaz who just happens to arrive. v. 3-4
  - 1. From a human perspective this is a coincidence. v. 3 1 Sam. 6:9 20:26 2 Sam. 1:6
  - 2. From the divine perspective this is an integral part of God's plan. Pr. 16:9 19:21
  - 3. Boaz arrives and exchanges blessings with his workers. v. 4
- B. Boaz inquires (and learns) about Ruth. v. 5-7
- C. Boaz shows favor to Ruth. v. 8-9
  - 1. Why does Boaz call Ruth, "daughter"? v. 8,22
  - 2. Boaz gladly fulfills his covenant duty.
  - 3. Boaz goes beyond his duty. 2 Sa. 23:17 Gen. 24:11,13 1 Sa. 9:11 Josh 9:21ff
- D. Boaz notices Ruth for all the right reasons. v. 10-11
  - 1. Ruth asks why Boaz would look upon her so favorably. v. 10 3:10-11 Pr. 31:10
  - 2. Boaz appreciates her extraordinary kindness and loyalty towards Naomi. v. 11a
  - 3. Boaz admires how Ruth turned from Moab and its gods to the LORD and His people. v. 11b,12b 1:16-17 Gen. 2:24 11:28 24:7
  - 4. She has sought refuge under the wings of the LORD, the God of Israel. v. 12b Ps. 91:4 36:7 57:1 61:4 Dt. 32:11ff 1 Ki. 6:24 9:6

- E. Boaz blesses and prays for Ruth. v. 12
  - 1. This is the second prayer for Ruth. Both will be answered. 1:8-9 Eph. 3:20
  - 2. Boaz prays that the LORD will reward her fully for what she has done. 1:21
  - 3. He also prays that the LORD will continue to protect her under His wings. 3:9
  - 4. If God deals with us according to grace then what place do rewards/wages have? Ro. 6:23 2 Co. 8:9 Ga. 3:10-13 6:7 Pr. 19:17 13:21 Php. 3:9 4:18-19 Mt. 25:31ff
- F. Ruth is comforted by the kindness of Boaz. v. 13
- G. Boaz shows further favor to Ruth. v. 15-16 Ps. 22:26

#### IV. Favor celebrated. v. 17-23

- A. Boaz sends Ruth home full. v. 17-18
  - 1. After working all day in the field she beats out the grain. v. 17a
  - 2. Ruth brings home a huge amount of grain an ephah (30 pounds?). v. 18b
  - 3. The quantity of grain reflects Boaz' generosity and Ruth's industry.
- B. Naomi revives, recognizing that God is blessing her. v. 19-20
  - 1. She thought that the LORD was against her, but now she acknowledges His kindness. v. 20 1:8,20-21 3:10 Ex. 15:13 Num. 14:18 Rom. 2:4
  - 2. This Boaz is our kinsman-redeemer. v. 20b
  - 3. Naomi is probably thinking ahead (even if Boaz and Ruth aren't (yet)). 3:1ff
- C. Ruth continues to glean in Boaz' field. v. 21-23

# V. Concluding applications.

- A. Lessons about God's providence. Romans 8:28 Lam. 3:19-26
  - 1. God truly is working all things together for those who love Him.
  - 2. It often takes a while for us to understand how He is working.
  - 3. God works through our efforts concurrence.
  - 4. God works through the faithfulness and love of His people.
  - 5. God works thorough the prayers of His people. 1:9 2:12
  - 6. God works through our ordinary decisions to bring about His perfect purpose.
  - 7. God works out His kind purpose in spite of human sin and failure.
  - 8. Trust God to meet your needs. Phil. 4:19 Mt. 6:33
- B. The story of Ruth and Naomi is our story in Christ.
  - 1. Favor needed we were empty and needed favor. Eph. 2:1-3 Rom. 3:10ff
  - 2. Favor granted God has shown us lovingkindness in Christ. Eph. 2:4ff Ro. 3:23ff
  - 3. Favor celebrated. Acts 13:48
