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Church Membership | Minimalism Review

The minimalist argument: Biblical exhortations and expectations that require an organized, corporate body to fulfill imply that Christians should be a part of such a body in order to fulfill them.

- Are to regularly gather with a group of believers in the name of Christ for Gospel exhortation and encouragement
- Are to be known and accountable to such a regular gathering and are perceived by others as belonging to the regular gathering
- Are to be under the authority of church leaders and submit to that authority
- Are to be the potential object of redemptive church discipline

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Church Discipline | Two Kinds

Formative Discipline—being disciplined for godliness (1 Tim. 4:7)

- Submission to elders (1 Pet. 5:5) and as appropriate, to one another (Eph. 5:21)
- Building others up and being built-up in Christ (Eph. 4:11-16)
- Receiving teaching, reproof, correction and training in righteousness (2 Tim. 3:16-17)
 - Formative discipline is the "discipleship" ministry of the church, broadly conceived.

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Church Discipline | Two Kinds

Corrective/Redemptive Church Discipline—protecting the purity of the church by restoration-aimed shaming

- Matt. 18:15-17
- 1 Cor. 5:1-5, 13
- 1 Tim. 1:20
- 2 Cor. 2:5-7
- Titus 3:10-11
- 2 Thess. 3:14-15
 - Church discipline is administered in cases of characteristic unrepentance that undercut the legitimacy of one's profession of faith in light of Scripture.

Corrective/Redemptive Church Discipline

Church Discipline on the Embassy Model

- With an embassy understanding of church membership, church discipline
 is an act that authoritatively revokes one's passport for the Kingdom.
 Importantly, it does not require or even involve individuals' speculation
 about someone's objective status before God. Rather, it is a public
 declaration by the embassy that one's public fruit cannot be squared with
 their public profession to represent and follow Jesus in light of Scripture.
 - · An inconsistent triad
 - Deep or personal familiarity with an individual being considered for church discipline is not required.

Corrective/Redemptive Church Discipline

- Church discipline seeks the repentance and redemption of the person under it while preserving regenerate church membership.
 - O Practicing redemptive church discipline without regenerate church membership is nearly, if not certainly, impossible. After all, what are we to make of a key-wielding declaration made jointly by believers and unbelievers?
 - One subtle technicality
 - Unrepentant sin that does not undercut one's claim to legitimate citizenship.

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
