I. Introduction.

II. We were in bondage. v. 1-3

- A. While the heir is still a minor, he lives under the authority of his guardians. v. 1-2
 - 1. He is the lord (owner/heir) of everything. 3:29
 - 2. But he can't enjoy his inheritance until he reaches adulthood.
 - 3. Guardians and managers are in control of his person and property.
 - 4. During his minority the son's life differs little from that of a slave.
 - 5. This situation was designed to be temporary.
- B. Though we are heirs, we once lived in bondage. v. 3
 - 1. God had always intended to give the inheritance to the sons of Abraham, but they had to go through years of minority (childhood) under the Law.
 - 2. What are the elemental things of the world which held us in bondage? 4:9
 - 3. God's people were in bondage under the Mosaic Law. 3:22-24 4:9 Rom. 10:3ff
 - 4. Paul could also be referring to the former religious practices of the Gentile believers. v. 8 Col. 2:8,20
 - 5. Either way, Paul's point is that we are done with the elemental religious practices which once enslaved us. John 1:17 Col. 2:20-23
 - 6. Sadly, some then and now remain in bondage and try to enslave others.
 - 7. They are behaving like the generation in Israel which wanted to return to Egypt. Num. 14:3-4

III. God sent His son to set us free. v. 4-5

- A. But when the fullness of time came. v. 4a
 - 1. Another "but God". Eph. 2:4
 - 2. Jesus is the Redeemer for Whom God's people have been eagerly waiting. Gen. 3:15 4:1 Deut. 18:15 2 Sam. 7:14 Mt. 1:1ff Luke 2:25-38 Mark 1:15
 - 3. Jesus came at the perfect time fixed by the sovereign Father. v. 2b Eph. 1:11
 - 4. What made this a particularly good time? Acts 5:35-36 Mt. 24:23f Lu. 3:15
 - 5. All of human history is divided by the time of the coming of Christ.
 - 6. The Judaizers who want to go back to the Law's bondage are out of sync with the times.
 - 7. God's timing is always perfect. Eph. 1:11 Rom. 8:28
- B. God sent forth His Son. v. 4b Rom. 8:3 John 3:16 5:23
 - 1. The Son is eternal. John 1:1-2 8:58 17:5 2 Co. 8:9 Phil. 2:6 1 CO. 8:6
 - 2. The Son is God. John 1:1-3 Col. 2:9 Heb. 1:3
 - 3. The Son came into the world to do the Father's will. Mt. 26:39 John 4:34 5:19
 - 4. The Father sent the Son into the world to make redemption through His death. Isa. 53:4-6,10 Acts 2:23 Mt. 21:37-39 Phil. 2:5-8
 - 5. Our salvation is the work of our Triune God.
- C. Born of a woman. v. 4c
 - 1. Is this a reference to the virgin birth? 4:23 Gen. 3:15 Isa. 7:14 Mt. 1:18-25
 - 2. Why doesn't Paul mention the woman's name?
 - 3. Jesus is fully human. John 1:14 4:6 19:28 Luke 1:35 Mt. 4:2
 - 4. Jesus possesses two natures in one divine person. Col. 2:9
 - 5. Why did the Son of God have to become a man? v. 5 Heb. 2:14-15 Rom. 8:3

- D. Born under the Law. v. 4d
 - 1. He was born while the Law was still in force.
 - 2. In order to redeem us from the law He had to meet its requirements. 3:13 Mt. 5:17-19 Rom. 8:3-4 2 Cor. 5:21 1 Pet. 3:18 2:22 1:19 Heb. 4:15
- E. God had a great and gracious purpose in sending His Son. v. 5
 - 1. So that He might redeem those who were under the law. v. 5a 1:4 3:13 Col. 1:13f
 - a. He purchased our release from slavery. 3:10,23 4:1-3
 - b. The price of our redemption was the cross. 3:13 1:4 1 Pet. 3:18 1:18-19 2 Co. 5:21 Heb. 7:26-27 2:14-17
 - c. Jesus Christ is uniquely qualified to be our redeemer. Ps. 49:7
 - 2. So that we might receive the adoption as sons. v. 5b Rom. 8:14-15 Mt. 28:10 Eph. 1:5 2 Co. 8:9 John 1:12-13
 - 3. The reality of your identity as a redeemed child of God is life transforming!

IV. Conclusion – Now you enjoy the full privileges of sonship. v. 6-7

- A. You enjoy the status of sonship. v. 7 2 Co. 3:17 Eph. 1:4 John 15:16 Dt. 7:7-8 1 Jo. 4:10,19
 - 1. You are no longer a slave but a son and an heir because of God's grace. v. 7
 - 2. Becoming a Christian is more than intellectual acceptance of propositional truth. It is entrance into a personal relationship with God.
 - 3. It is a great privilege to call God your Father. Mt. 6:9 Eph. 3:14 Ps. 103:8-14
 - 4. You have a great inheritance from God. Ps. 16:5-6 73:5-6
 - 5. What an incentive to prayer and worship! Eph. 2:18 Heb. 4:16
- B. You enjoy the experience of sonship through the Indwelling Spirit. v. 6
 - 1. With the coming of Christ, God's children experience the Spirit in a new and wonderful way. 3:2-5 Acts 1:5,8 2:17-21,33 Joel. 2:28-32 1 Co. 2:14 2 Co. 3:16
 - 2. God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son into your hearts. v. 6 3:2-3 Ro. 8:15-17,9 2 Co. 1:22 5:5 Eph. 1:13-14
 - 3. The Spirit is *sent forth* just as the Son was *sent forth* by God the Father. v. 4 John 15:26 16:13-14 14:16
 - 4. He is the pledge of your inheritance. Eph. 1:13-14 2 Co. 5:5
 - 5. In what way does the indwelling Spirit cry Abba Father? Rom. 8:15,26-27 Mark 14:36
 - 6. What does it mean that the Holy Spirit dwells in your heart? Eph. 3:16-17 Rom. 10:10 Pr. 4:23 Mt. 15:19 22:37
 - 7. How do you experience the Holy Spirit? 5:22-24 Ro. 8:16,13-14,26 Jo. 16:8,13
- C. After God has done all of this for you, why would you want to go back to slavery? Rom. 5:18 John 15:15 Deut. 15:15
