- a. His authority in teaching
 - 1. John 12:49
 - 2. The spiritual emptiness in the teaching of scribes and Pharisees
- b. His power in healing
 - Demons and diseases could only obey
- c. All you could do was to be amazed What *amazement* looked like

II. Jesus cleanses a leper

- a. Leviticus and the *law* of leprosy Lev. 13:45-46
- b. Trench: Consider the 'living death' of leprosy
- c. NOTE: The Kingdom of Heaven belongs to spiritual lepers
- d. The instruction to say nothing to anyone Mark 1:45ff

III. Jesus' challenge to a centurion

- a. Is Jesus asking a deliberative rhetorical question? "I having come will heal him"?
- b. Did he recognize the consequences accompanying his request?
- c. How worthy are you?
- d. The centurion's protest solidifies the level of his faith

IV. Jesus' challenge to the crowd: "... nowhere in Israel..."

- a. John the Baptist? (Mt. 11:2-5)
- b. Mary and Joseph? (Luke 2:43)
- c. The terrible warning about choosing unbelief

V. The dark side of unbelief

- a. The weeping and the gnashing of teeth
- b. The reminder of the narrow gate proverb?
- c. Choose the invitation into the hospitality of our God

VI. Jesus was amazed only twice

- a. The mathematical mind of a savant
- b. Mark 6:1-6 The offense of the crowds' astonishment
- c. "In faith there is enough light for those who want to believe and enough shadows to blind those who don't believe." - Pascal
