

Aliens are Fronting for the New Age **by Fred DeRuvo – Study-Grow-Know Ministries**

Thanks for joining me today. Last time, we introduced the subject of a TV mini-series called “The Fallen,” in which a young man – Aaron Corbett – learns he’s really a Nephilim *and* the Redeemer of other fallen angels. He comes in contact with a fallen angel named Azazel who laughs when Aaron says that many believe Jesus Christ to be the Son of God. Azazel states that he’s “been away for a while.”

Azazel certainly would have known of Jesus since the Bible declares Him to be God the Son, the Creator of all things (cf. John 1, Colossians 1, etc.). In essence, Azazel – a created being, as Lucifer and all other entities apart from God were created – would have known of God, which consisted then (and consists now) of three individuals; God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. But let’s not let biblical facts stand in the way of a science-fiction mini-series.

The mini-series is based on novels by Thomas E. Sniegoski. There is of course a good deal of biblical imagery here as well as indirect references to the *Book of Enoch*, an extra-biblical manuscript that some commentators believe to have been authentically written by *the* biblical Enoch and carried on the Ark with Noah. It is clear that both Peter and Jude knew of this book because both writers either quote from it or reference it in their epistles. It is also likely that Jesus was familiar with it.

The mini-series starts out with a voice-over explaining the premise. Satan rebels. Angels rebel with him. They all fall to earth. Once there, the fallen angels distance themselves from Satan, cohabit with human women and have children that have the bodies and abilities of angels, but with the souls of men.

The series unfolds with the realization that other angels are out to destroy all the fallen angels wherever they are found. Of course, Aaron, who turns out to be one of the Nephilim, is hunted as well when he turns 18 and clearly becomes one. Interesting how the good angels seem more evil than the Nephilim in the mini-series.

Tom Skerritt plays one of the fallen angels who tries to help Aaron understand his predetermined role, not only as a Nephilim, but also as *The Redeemer*. Of course Aaron rebels against this idea, but is slowly brought around to the fact that that is the truth about him.

Aside from all of the extra-biblical fantasy here, there are plenty of references to New Age teachings and ideals. When Tom Skerritt’s character mentions “the Creator,” Aaron says, “*God?*” Skerritt laughs and says that the name “God” is too small to describe the Creator.

He then sings out that whether it's Allah, Shiva, or something else altogether, the Creator is all of these things.

The problem with this mini-series is that it attempts to be seen as biblical, but it is far from it. It wears biblical clothing so to speak, but that's as far as it goes. While some may argue that screenwriter Tim Huddleston was merely taking some liberties, it is clear from anyone who knows Scripture at all that there is hardly anything in the series that coincides with Scripture, except some of the names of entities and the general idea that some good angels fell, becoming evil ones.

The angels in the mini-series are obnoxious and even swear. They are sarcastic and denigrating toward the "creator." They fight to kill and make deals with the devil. Above all, the entire premise of the series is way off base. Scripture never indicates that the fallen angels, once having fallen, ever left Satan's loyalties. Beyond this, there is never any indication in Scripture that Nephilim are able to be redeemed. Once fallen, they remain fallen, unlike human beings who have the chance to be redeemed through God's plan of salvation.

The reason for this difference is due solely to the fact that only humanity was created in God's image (Genesis 1-2). God literally breathed into man and Adam became a living soul. This is not true of the angels or animals.

The Fallen essentially supports much of the New Age and their view of aliens. There are many references within the world of aliens to God (whatever God is said to be by these aliens) and our ability to become whatever we want to become. Though Aaron is one of the Nephilim in the series, it takes him time to realize he is someone other than what he has known all of his life. Once he learns his true identity, he begins the process of actualizing that true identity within him, drawing on all of the latent powers that stem from it.

This is no different than the metamorphosis that human beings are taught we will go through as we come to terms with our own inner *deity*. The process of unlocking that deity and living from that core or center is something that is to be achieved by all human beings.

The Fallen (like many movies before it) is really an operation manual to help humanity unlock our true potential. Once we do that, we acknowledge and embrace our deity, and from there will truly be able to make this world a far better place.

Joseph Chambers (Prophecy Forum Newsletter) wrote an article titled *Satan is Practicing for Armageddon*. In it, he points out the fact that what we see occurring today is bound up within the New Age Movement. The problem is that like the TV series *The Fallen* and movies like *Knowing*, the biblical language and terminology used within these vehicles (to unconsciously promote the New Age) can actually confuse many people.

In other words, Christian-sounding terminology is deceptive because there is usually another meaning applied to those terms that are often thought to be orthodox. I have pointed this out in this book and others I have written, and Chambers points this out as well. *“Biblical terminology literally fills the writings and language of the New Ager and occultic leaders. They talk about the number 666, about saving the world (not souls), and about a harmonious, peace-loving age when everybody lives happily ever after.”*¹ He then quotes a number of individuals and sources that do that very thing.

“The blueprint for a peaceful, loving and harmonious world has been drawn. Prayer, meditation, positive affirmations, spiritual families and global healing events such as Live Aid and the World Peace Event all contribute to this blueprint.” – Harmonic Convergence brochure

“Humanity is on the verge of something entirely new, a further evolutionary step unlike any other: the emergence of the first global civilization.” – Thomas Berry, Catholic theologian

“I [see] images of a new heaven and a new earth...THIS WORLD will be saved. The planet will be healed and harmonized. We can let the kingdom come...which means that THIS WORLD can be transformed into a heaven right now...This is no fantasy. This is not scientific or religious fiction. This is the main event of our individual lives.” – John Randolph Price, Organizer of the World Instant of Cooperation

“Every major religion of the world has similar ideals of love, the same goal of benefitting humanity through spiritual practice...The most important thing is to look at details of theology or metaphysics...I believe that all the major religions of the world can contribute to world peace and work together for the benefit of humanity if we put aside subtle metaphysical differences, which are really the internal business of each religion...The undying faith in religion clearly demonstrates the potency of religion as such. There are a number of problems with the thoughts of those quoted above. In short, they are directly opposed to the clear teaching of Scripture. Regarding the quote from the *Harmonic Convergence* brochure, this merely reveals that these individuals believe that to attain the level of living divinely in the fourth dimension, a world filled with goodwill and

good works *must* become the norm for all people on the planet. For these people, goodwill (as evidenced by good works) will save individuals and ultimately the planet. However, the Bible tells us that we are *not* saved by works at all, but by the free gift of salvation made possible by Jesus (cf. Ephesians 2:8-10). Good works *stem* from authentic salvation, but not the other way around.
