King David becomes a Divinely sanctioned Royal Dynasty King because God promises that through him His divine King will come who will rule forever (II Sam. 7:8-16; II Chron. 13:5).

Descendants of David will rule for about the next 400 years as the kings of Judah and then they will disappear until the anointed Davidic King, Jesus Christ, comes to Israel.

7) David makes Jerusalem the capital of Israel.

Date: 1000 B.C.

8) Solomon becomes King of Israel.

Solomon is born in 991 B.C.

Solomon becomes King in 970 B.C.

Solomon is the last king to reign over the united nation of Israel. After Solomon, the nation will split with ten tribes of Israel to the north and two tribes of Judah to the south. Each group will have their own king.

9) Solomon builds the First <u>Temple</u> in Jerusalem.

Solomon begins construction 480 years after Israel moves out of Egypt (I Kings 6:1).

Date: 966 B.C..

Solomon completed the Temple construction in seven years (I Kings 6:1 - year 4 start I Kings 6:38 year 11 it is finished). **Date: 966 B.C. - 959 B.C.**

- 10) Israel is <u>divided</u> as a nation and they split with Israel in the north and Judah in the south. **Date: 931 B.C.-930 B.C.**
- 11) Israel chooses her own kings all of whom, with the exception of one, did evil.

They will reign for the next 209 years in Israel's history (931 B.C. - 722 B.C.)

- 1. Jeroboam (**931 B.C. 910 B.C.**) I Kings 11:26-14:20; II Chron. 9:29-13:22. Solomon's servant who did evil. He ruled 22 years.
- 2. Nadab (910 B.C.-909 B.C.) Kings 15:25-28- he did evil. He ruled 2 years.
- 3. Baasha (909 B.C.-886 B.C.) -I Kings 15:27-16:7 he did evil. He ruled 24 years.
- 4. Elah (**886 B.C.**) I Kings 16:8-14 he did evil he ruled 2 years.
- 5. Zimri (**886 B.C.**) I Kings 16:9-20 he did evil he ruled <u>7</u> days killed Elah and committed suicide.
- 6. Omri (**885 B.C. -874 B.C.**) I Kings 16:15-28 he did evil built and made Samaria the capital of Israel. He reigned 11 years.
- 7. Ahab (**874 B.C.-853 B.C.**) I Kings 16:29-22:40 he did evil promotes Baal worship in Samaria. He reigned 21 years.
- 8. Ahaziah (**853 B.C.**) I Kings 22:51-53; II Kings 1:1-18 he did evil. He ruled 2 years.
- 9. Jehoram (Joram) **(853 B.C.-841 B.C.) -** II Kings 3:1-925; II Chron. 22:5-7 he did evil. He ruled <u>12</u> years.

- 10. Jehu (**841 B.C.-814 B.C.**) II Kings 9:1-10:36; II Chron. 22:7-12 he did some good but also some evil. He ruled <u>27</u> years.
- 11. Jehoahaz (**814 B.C.-798 B.C.**) II Kings 13:1-9 he did evil. He ruled <u>17</u> years.
- 12. Jehoash (Joash) (**798 B.C.-782 B.C.**) II Kings 13:10-14:16 he did evil. He ruled <u>16</u> years.
- 13. Jeroboam II (**793 B.C.-753 B.C.**) II Kings 14:23-29 he did evil. He ruled <u>40</u> years.
- 14. Zachariah (**753 B.C.-752 B.C.**) II Kings 14:29-15:12 he did evil. Ruled <u>6</u> months and was assassinated.
- 15. Shallum (**752 B.C.**) II Kings 15:10-15 he did evil. He ruled <u>1</u> month and was killed by Menahem.
- 16. Menahem (**752 B.C.-742 B.C.**) II Kings 15:14-22 he did evil. He ruled 10 years
- 17. Pekahiah (**742 B.C.-740 B.C.**) II Kings 15:22-26 he did evil. He ruled <u>2</u> years.
- 18. Pekah (**752 B.C.-732 B.C.**) II Kings 15:27-31; II Chron. 28:5-8 he did evil. He ruled <u>20</u> years. He was killed by Hoshea.
- 19. Hoshea (732 B.C.-722 B.C.) II Kings 17:1-16 he is last king of Israel and he is evil. He ruled 10 years.
- 12) Israel is defeated by the <u>Assyrians</u> and the ten northern tribes are exiled. Date: 722 B.C. 720 B.C.
- 13) Judah had 20 kings after Solomon from **930 B.C.-586 B.C..** Twelve are bad and eight were good. **They will reign for the next 344 years in Judah (930 B.C.-586 B.C.).**
 - 1. Rehoboam (**930 B.C.-913 B.C.**) I Kings 11:42-14:31; II Chron. 9:31-12:16 he reigned <u>17</u> years and was bad.
 - 2. Abijah (Abijam) (**913 B.C.-911 B.C.**) I Kings 14:31-15:8; II Chron.13:1-23 he reigned <u>3</u> years and was bad.
 - 3. Asa (**911 B.C.-870 B.C.**) I Kings 15:8-24; II Chron. 13:23-16:14 he reigned <u>41</u> years and was good.
 - 4. Jehoshaphat (**870 B.C.-848 B.C.**) I Kings 15:24; 22:41-51; II Chron. 21:1-20 he reigned <u>25</u> years and was good.
 - 5. Jehoram (**848 B.C.-841 B.C.**) II Kings 8:16-24; II Chron. 21:1-20 he reigned <u>8</u> years and was bad.
 - 6. Ahaziah (**841 B.C.**) II Kings 8:24-29; 9:14-26; II Chron. 22:1-12 he reigned <u>1</u> year and was had
 - 7. Queen Athaliah (**841 B.C.-835 B.C.**) II Kings 8:26; 11:1-20; II Chron. 21:6; 22:2, 9-23:21 She reigned 6 years and was bad.
 - 8. Jehoash (Joash) (**835 B.C.-796 B.C.**) II Kings 11:1-12:21; II Chron. 22:10-23; 24:27)- He reigned 40 years and was good.
 - 9. Amaziah (**796 B.C.-781 B.C.**) II Kings 14:1-22; II Chron. 24:27-25:28) He reigned <u>29</u> years and was good.
 - 10. Uzziah (**781 B.C.-740 B.C.**) II Kings 15:1-7; II Chron. 26:1-23 he reigned <u>52</u> years and started good but ended bad.
 - 11. Jotham (**740 B.C.-736 B.C.**) II Kings 15:32-38; II Chron. 26:21-23 (regent); 26:23-27:9 (king). He served 16 years and was good.

- 12. Ahaz (**736 B.C.-716 B.C.**) II Kings 15:38-16:20; II Chron. 27:9-28:27 he served <u>16</u> years and was bad.
- 13. Hezekiah (**716 B.C.-687 B.C.**) II Kings 16:20; 18:1-20:21; II Chron. 28:27-32:33 he served 29 years and was good.
- 14. Manasseh (**697 B.C.-642 B.C.**) II Kings 21:1-18; II Chron. 32:33-33:20 he served <u>55</u> years and was bad.
- 15. Amon (**642 B.C.-640 B.C.**) II Kings 21:18-26; II Chron. 33:20-25 he served <u>2</u> years and was bad.
- 16. Josiah (**640 B.C.-609 B.C.**) II Kings 21:26-23:30; II Chron. 33:25-35:27 he served <u>31</u> years and was good.
- 17. Jehoahaz (**609 B.C.**) II Kings 23:30-34; II Chron. 36:1-4 he served <u>3</u> months and was bad.
- 18. Jehoiakim (name changed to Eliakim) (**609 B.C.-598 B.C.**) II Kings 23:34-24:6; II Chron. 36:5-8) he served 11 years and was bad.
- 19. Jehoiachin (Coniah/Jechoniah) (**598 B.C.-597 B.C.**) II Kings 24:6-17; II Chron. 36:8-10 he served 3 months and was bad.
- 20. Zedekiah (**597 B.C.-586 B.C.**) II Kings 24:17-25:30; II Chron. 36:10-13; Jer. 52:1-3; 37-39; Ez. 17:13-16 he reigned 11 years and was bad.
- 14) Judah is defeated and conquered by <u>Babylonians</u> and most southern tribe Jews are exiled. Date: 586 B.C.
- 15) Jerusalem and the Temple in Jerusalem are <u>destroyed</u> by the Babylonians. Date: 586 B.C.

Nebuchadnezzar conquered Jerusalem, burned it and destroyed the Temple that Solomon had built and exiled the Israelites to Babylon. This was a fulfillment of what Moses wrote in the Torah - Deuteronomy 28:49-52, 63-64.

16) Persia defeats the Babylonians and permits the exiled <u>Jews</u> to return from Babylonia to her land in Israel. **Date: 539 B.C.-538 B.C.**

The Persian Emperor Cyrus conquered Babylon and he permitted the Jews to return to the land.

- 17) Jerusalem and the Temple are rebuilt. Date: 538 B.C.-515 B.C.
- 18) Persia controls the land of Israel from **538 B.C-333 B.C.**.

Israel was not an independent nation at this time but was part of the Persian Empire. During this time the city of Jerusalem was rebuilt and the Temple known as the Second Temple was rebuilt.
