Matthew 8:18-26

If a woman has a discharge of blood for many days, not at the time of her menstrual impurity, or if she has a discharge beyond the time of her impurity, all the days of the discharge she shall continue in uncleanness. As in the days of her impurity, she shall be unclean. Every bed on which she lies, all the days of her discharge, shall be to her as the bed of her impurity. And everything on which she sits shall be unclean, as in the uncleanness of her menstrual impurity. And whoever touches these things shall be unclean, and shall wash his clothes and bathe himself in water and be unclean until evening.

## Leviticus 15:25-27

Do you recognize the authority of Jesus? One of the intriguing storylines in this text is Jairus coming to Jesus for help. The previously recorded appearances of Jesus at the synagogue in Capernaum did not go well. There was great opposition, even burning hatred towards Jesus among the people there. And yet, this ruler knew Jesus was the last hope for his daughter. In today's Christian culture, it is common to say that we are "to make Jesus our Lord." Jesus is already Lord whether we accept that fact or not. Do you recognize the authority of Jesus over your life?

Do you believe in Jesus' power to save? Jesus declared that the woman's faith saved her. Mark claims that Jesus has the power to resurrect the dead. Do you have the faith of Jairus or the woman?
