Introduction: Acts 2:41 & 42 – The roots of Discipleship as defined by the Wheel Illustration is seen in the practices of the early Church.


- A. The Wheel speaks to experiencing the power of Christ in our daily lives



B. In warfare, when the shield is a defensive tool the duel is over. – Ephesians 6:16 commands "TAKE UP..."

#### The Shield Of Faith
