 - A. Descendant of priestly family (male above) /related to royal family of Hasmoneans (female)
 - B. Wandered in desert at age 16 for 3 years with Banus (an ascetic)
 - C. To Rome at 26 to plead for lives of Jewish priests
 - D. Played some role in military in Galilee against Vespasian
- E. Holds out at Jotapata for 6 weeks, then hides in cave with 40 others (suicide)
 - F. Captured by Romans where he serves as aide/interpreter
 - G. Returns to Rome with Titus, Vespasian's son
 - H. Vespasian
 - 1. Offers him place in his home
 - 2. Roman citizenship
 - 3. Imperial pension
 - 4. Commission to write
 - I. Wars of the Jews (81AD)
 - J. Antiquities of the Jews (94AD)

- A. Alexander Yannai, Hasmonean high priest Jonathan fortify Masada
 - 1. There were 8 Hasmonean fortresses

- Judah of Gamla on the Golan (i.e., Judah of Galilee in Acts
 The Galileans Sicarii
- 2. Zadok the Pharisee from Jerusalem the Jerusalemites
- B. Extreme Pharisees liberty
 - 1. God alone was their king
 - 2. Willing to die before acknowledging Caesar
 - 3. A sacrilege to submit to Rome
- C. The Galileans Sicarii (people of the little daggers)
- 1. Would stab opponents in crowds (assassins) ostentatious lamentation after
 - 2. Opponents were Romans or those sympathetic
 - 3. In 66AD leader was Menahem Ben Judah
- D. The Jerusalemites leaders was Eleazar, son of Hananiah the High Priest
- IV. The War of 66-74AD
 - A. War breaks out at Caesarea by the Sea
 - B. Menahem storms Masada
 - 1. Takes arms
 - 2. Captures Jerusalem
 - 3. Apprehends and executes Eleazar and brother
 - 4. Menahem considers himself "King of Jerusalem"
 - 5. Jerusalem Zealots kill Menahem and most of his men
 - 6. A small band of Sicarii escapes to Masada under Eleazar Ben Yair (Menahem's cousin)
 - C. Sicarii remain at Masada from fall of 66 74AD
 - 1. They raid villages (Hebron, En Gedi)
 - D. Rome continues under Bassus
 - 1. Takes Herodium
 - 2. Takes Machaerus (Jordanian side)
