For instance


Buckminster Fuller created the “Knowledge Doubling Curve”; he noticed that until 1900 human knowledge doubled approximately every century. By the end of World War II knowledge was doubling every 25 years. Today things are not as simple as different types of knowledge have different rates of growth. For example, nanotechnology knowledge is doubling every two years and clinical knowledge every 18 months. But

on average human knowledge is doubling every 13 months. According to IBM, the build out of the “internet of things” will lead to the doubling of knowledge every 12 hours.

Human Brain Indexing Will Consume Several Billion Petabytes

In a recent lecture at Harvard University neuroscientist Jeff Lichtman, who is attempting to map the human brain, has calculated that several billion petabytes of data storage would be needed to index the entire human brain. (A megabyte is 1 million bytes, A

Gigabyte is 1 Thousand Megabytes, A Terabyte is 1000 Gigabytes and a Petabyte is 1000 Terabytes or 1 Thousand million, million, million bytes)



The (entire) Internet is currently estimated to be 5 million terabytes (TB) of which Google has indexed roughly 200 TB or just .

004% of its total size. The numbers involved are astounding especially when considering the size of the human brain and the number of neurons in it.

Linear to Exponential Growth of Human Knowledge

A transition from the linear growth of human knowledge to the exponential growth of human knowledge has taken place.. According to researchers dealing with this information will necessitate the development of vastly more complex software, shareability, and artificial intelligence.

“Of all the essays that appear between 1980 and 1988 less than one percent made even a remote reference to Scripture or any theological idea despite the fact many of the topics are treated in the Bible. As the journal turns away from the Bible to what it believe to be more fruit means of knowledge, it is redefining christian ministry and the pastor who accepts its point of view. In the study the evangelical pastor is the CEO, in the pulpit the pastor is a psychologist whose task it is to engineer good relations and warm feelings”

“A new species is now adrift in the world and is now washing up along the shores of evangelical life.

It is a species eager to exchange enduring qualities for a spat of exciting new experiences that thinks in terms of images rather than truths, that has no place from which to view the world and shifts from people to people in an attempt to catch the passing sights, a voyager rather than a thinker guided by a compass of circumstances rather than belief....

Simply put the psychologizing of the faith is destroying the christian mind. It is destroying Christians habits of thought because it is destroying the capacity to think about life in a Christian fashion. It is as if the top soil were being washed away leaving the land barren and incapable of being cultivated. It can no longer sustain the bountiful harvest of being able to discern between good and evil, to think about life in terms of God and His purposes... All of this is lost. And when people are no longer compelled by Gods Truth, they can be compelled by anything. The more so if it has the sheen of excitement or the lure of the novel.. the heretics of old, one would suspect, would envy if they know of the easy pickings that can now be had in the church”

You are told as a pastor in most seminaries today that if you have someone come to office who needs counseling and they don't understand the Trinity,

they you can help them. BUT if they say that they are a member of the Trinity then you need to refer them, because that is beyond you and you need to leave that to the professionals.

Just recently I witnessed that very thing.

The ERLC the SBC entity, hosted an event called “Caring Well”

The intention and reason was good. Its was organized and promoted for the purpose of helping churches deal with the rising problem of sexual abuse within churches.

Two things really stood out to me.

1st It was a platform to promote women in pastoral leadership, because women are better suited for dealing with this problem.

2. It made it very clear that the pastors are not capable of dealing with this complex problem and that these situations should be referred to the professionals.

In other words, Gods Word and His Spirit are not sufficient to deal with and help those who have experienced some of the most traumatic situations in life.

We need the ideas developed by men who don’t believe in God, His Word or His Spirit.

So to combat the problem, they spent a decade and 12 billion dollars to develop a pen that writes in zero gravity, upside down, underwater, and on glass or any other surface and from way below freezing to 300 degrees centigrade

2. The Answer that Jesus Gives to the disciple indicates more than a physical appearance. This is the promise of the Presence and Indwelling of the Holy Spirit.
