Intro: Parental disappointment in children can be due

A. Unrealistic expectations

- B. Unbiblical methods using the wrong instrument
 - 1. Though the law is good, it is powerless to change the heart of the convict
 - 2. The instrument to change the heart is the Gospel

Honor My Authority (4)

I. As you exercise it as parents II. As you respond to it

- I. God's calling for parents (Eph. 6:4; Col. 3:21)
- A. We are not to provoke them wrath or discouragement
 - 1. What does this mean?
 - a. Not: spare the rod that might anger them
 - see God's examples: Gen 4; Lev. 26:27-28; Heb. 12:6; Prov. 13:24; 22:15; 23:13-14
 - b. But: do all to make obedience to authority easier (Eph. 5:22-25)
 - 2. Two methods or manners that *provoke to anger or discourage children* a. whatever *provokes* the *child's spirit* instead of target *child's sin*

B. We are to 'bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.'

1. Bring them up (compare with 5:29)
2. Nurture: training by our actions (Heb. 12: 5, 7, 8)
3. Admonition: training by our words (Luke 15; 22:25-27; 31-32)
Closing: Parenting children is often God's way of parenting us to come to Jesus!

b. Treating all *disobedience* as purposeful rebellion
