INTRODUCTION: THE VALUE OF VULNERABILITY

The depth of a relationship is equal to the willingness of both parts to be vulnerable.

Proper Prayer Attitudes So Far

Desperation, sincerity, humility, love, and persistence

Jesus shows us two types of prayers in Luke 18, the prayer from insecurity and the prayer from vulnerability. The lesson is simple:

Proposition: God hears the prayers of vulnerable people.

I. A PRAYER FROM INSECURITY

Insecurity

Uncertainty or anxiety about oneself that seeks to preserve oneself from danger or exposure.

A. INSECURE PRAYERS CAN'T REVEAL WHO THEY TRULY ARE, VV. 11, 12

1. Some People Seek The Safety of Silence

- 2. The Pharisee Found Safety In Cleverly Crafted Words
- a. The pharisee was probably telling the truth
- i. I am not a swindler
- ii. I am not unjust
- iii. I am not I am not an adulterer
- iv. I am not like this tax collector
- v. I fast twice a week
- vi. I pay tithes of all that I get
- ? What is missing?
- b. The pharisee wasn't telling the whole truth
- B. INSECURE PRAYERS SIT IN JUDGEMENT ON OTHERS, VV. 11, 12
- 1. Sometimes this happens in silence.
- 2. Sometimes this happens out loud.

God did not hear his prayer.

II. A PRAYER FROM VULNERABILITY, V. 13

A. VULNERABLE PRAYERS ARE NOT CONCERNED WITH WHAT OTHERS SEE OR HEAR

We see this kind of vulnerability throughout Scripture.

Not only are we called to be vulnerable before God, but we see that we are called to be vulnerable toward each other in the church.

The Bible says not to be naïve, but naivete is different from vulnerability.

Vulnerability is not weakness; it is entrusting yourself to the care of God as you practice loving others.
