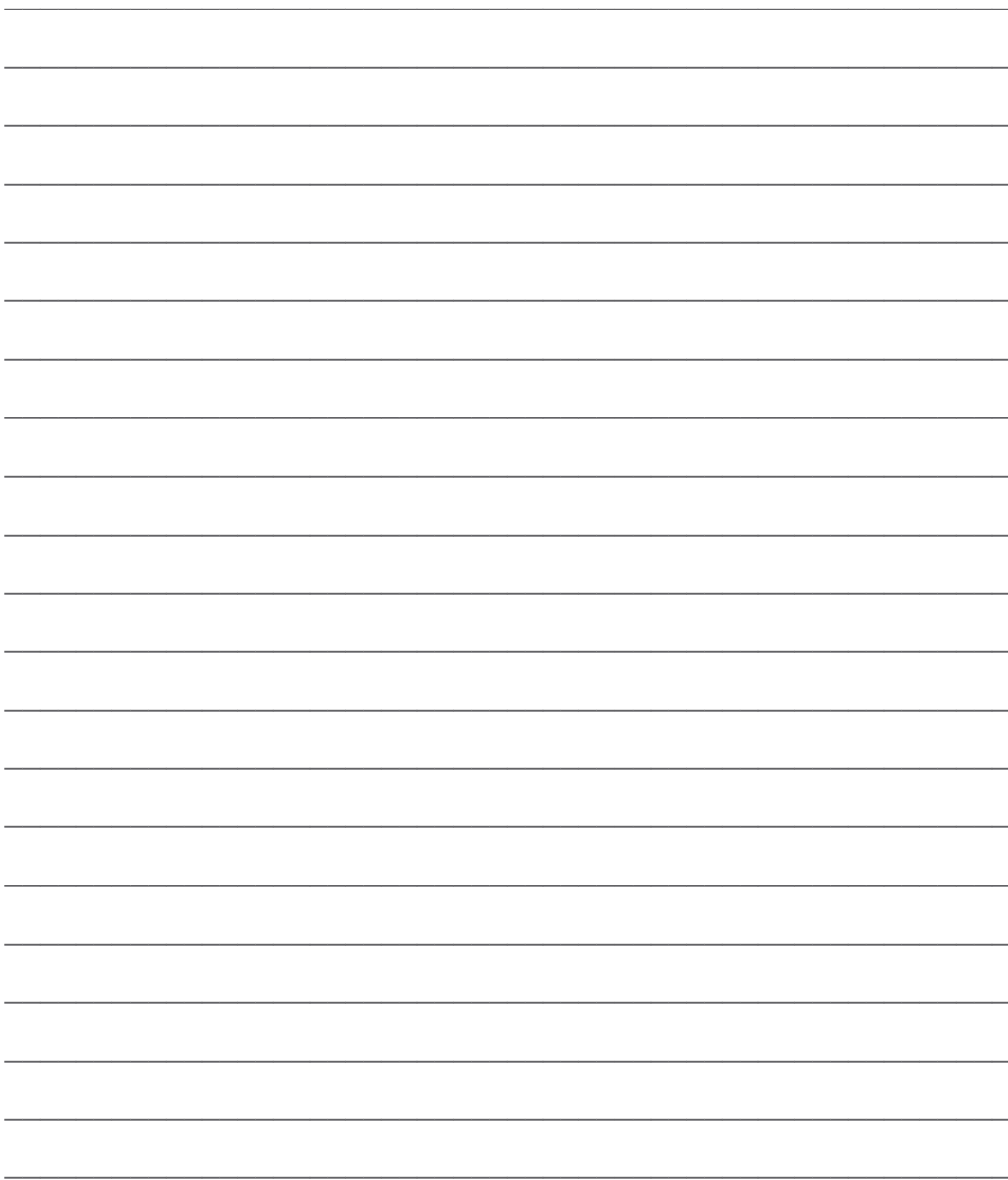
1 O LORD, how many are my foes! Against me many rise.
