IV. The Dispensation of the Patriarchs-Gen 11:31-Ex 11

- A. Review *Our working definition:* "A dispensation is God's distinctive method of governing mankind or a group of men during a period of human history, marked by a crucial event, test, failure, and judgment. From the divine standpoint, it is a stewardship, a rule of life, or a responsibility for managing God's affairs in His house. From the historical standpoint it is a stage in the progress of revelation" (Nevin, quoted in Ryrie, "Dispensationalism" p. 30. 1995)
- B. Standing Rules from the previous dispensations
 - 1. Be Fruitful and Multiply
 - 2. Fill the earth
 - 3. No killing or be killed
 - 4. Eat meat with no blood in it

C. Abraham

- 1. Speculation about Terah Ge 11:31-32
 - a. vs 31-Terah took his son Abram and his grandson Lot, the son of Haran, and his daughter-in-law Sarai, his son Abram's wife, and they went out with them from Ur of the Chaldeans to go to the land of Canaan; and they came to Haran and dwelt there.
 - b. Some think that God may have called Terah and that after he moved, got comfortable and stopped in Haran no revelation of this
 - c. Maybe God called Abram and he brought his father until he got sick and died again no revelation unless we consider Abram as disobedient not a problem
- 2. Moving from the world to Israel
 - a. The Previous dispensations have dealt with all of the inhabitants of the world
 - b. As we move through the Patriarchs, God's dealings narrow to one family
 - i. Abraham has two sons in the life of Sarah for in Isaac your seed shall be called. Ge 21:12
 - ii. Isaac has two sons Ge 25:23 And the LORD said to her: "Two nations are in your womb, Two peoples shall be separated from your body; One people shall be stronger than the other, And the older shall serve the younger."

iii. Jacob

- Ge 32:28 And He said, "Your name shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel; for you have struggled with God and with men, and have prevailed."
- Joseph was used by God to keep this family together to become a great nation

- 3. The call of Abram Crisis
 - a. Abram's Part Get out
 - i. of your country,
 - ii. From your family
 - iii. And from your father's house,
 - iv. To a land
 - b. God's Part I will
 - i. show you a land
 - ii. make you a great nation;
 - iii. bless you
 - And make your name great;
 - And you shall be a blessing.
 - iv. bless those who bless you,
 - v. And curse him who curses you;
 - vi. And in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."
- 4. The Process of working out the call 12:4-13:14
 - a. Abram's partial obedience and it's results vs 4-9
 - i. Abram departed as the LORD had spoken to him
 - ii. and Lot went with him
 - iii. Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran.
 - iv. So, they came to the land of Canaan.
 - v. Vs 7 Then the LORD appeared to Abram and said, "To your descendants I will give this land."
 - b. God bringing him to full obedience 12:10-13:14 Judgment
 - i. Now there was a famine in the land, vs 10
 - ii. Agreement with Sarai and it's results vs 11-20
 - Your beautiful, they will kill me, say you're my sister vs 11-13
 - Sold his wife for riches vs 14-16
 - Plague brings confrontation of Abram vs 17-20
 - iii. Abram and Lot go home rich vs 1-13
 - Note: 12:8; 13:4 Abram called on the name of the Lord
 - Their abundance brings about obedience
 - iv. God appears and speaks vs 14-18
 - "Lift your eyes now and look from the place where you arenorthward, southward, eastward, and westward;
 - "for all the land which you see I give to you and your descendants forever.
 - "And I will make your descendants as the dust of the earth; so that if a man could number the dust of the earth, then your descendants also could be numbered.
 - "Arise, walk in the land through its length and its width, for I give it to you."
- 5. The Abrahamic Covenant Ge 15 *Mercy* (Unconditional)
 - a. The Pre-covenant discussion vs 1-12

- i. No Fear b/c of Who God is vs 1
- ii. I still don't have a son vs 2-3
- iii. You will have a son and descendants numbered like the stars vs 4-5
- iv. Abraham believed vs 6
- b. Prep for the covenant -vs 7
 - i. "I am the LORD, who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to inherit it."
 - ii. Lord GOD, how shall I know that I will inherit it?
 - iii. Get the animals prepared
 - "Bring Me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old female goat, a three-year-old ram, a turtledove, and a young pigeon."
 - Then he brought all these to Him and cut them in two, down the middle, and placed each piece opposite the other; but he did not cut the birds in two.
 - And when the vultures came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away.
- c. Sleep and Prophecy vs 12-16
 - i. when the sun was going down,
 - a deep sleep fell upon Abram;
 - and behold, horror and great darkness fell upon him.
 - ii. Prophecy about Egypt
 - your descendants will be strangers in a land that is not theirs, they will serve them, and they will afflict them four hundred years.
 - And also the nation whom they serve I will judge; afterward they shall come out with great possessions.
 - "Now as for you, you shall go to your fathers in peace; you shall be buried at a good old age.
 - "But in the fourth generation they shall return here, for the iniquity of the Amorites is not yet complete."
- d. The Cutting of the Covenant vs 17-21 Mercy
 - i. Passing between the cut animals
 - Heb 6:13 For when God made promise to Abraham, because he could swear by no greater, he swore by himself,
 - there appeared a smoking oven and a burning torch that passed between those pieces. vs 17
 - ii. The Covenant "To your descendants I have given this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the River Euphrates- vs 18
- 6. Twofold Judgment
 - a. Lot as described above
 - b. Ishmael
 - i. Received Hagar from Pharaoh for Sarah
 - ii. Hagar despised Sarah Ge 16:4
 - iii. Ishmael mocks Isaac Ge 21:9
 - iv. Abraham had to kick out Hagar and Ishmael Ge 21:10-13

- 7. A Second Covenant Gen 17 (Conditional)
 - a. The Pre-covenant discussion vs 1-3
 - i. Abram was ninety-nine years old
 - ii. "I am Almighty God; walk before Me and be blameless.
 - iii. I will make My covenant between Me and you, and will multiply you exceedingly.
 - b. God's Blessing vs 4
 - i. you shall be a father of many nations.
 - ii. Change of name Abram to Abraham for I have made you a father of many nations.
 - I will make you exceedingly fruitful;
 - and I will make nations of you,
 - and kings shall come from you
 - iii. A covenant with you and your descendants forever
 - between Me and you and your descendants after you in their generations, for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and your descendants after you.
 - I give to you and your descendants after you the land in which you are a stranger, all the land of Canaan, as an everlasting possession; and I will be their God."
 - "As for you, you shall keep My covenant, you and your descendants after you throughout their generations.
 - iv. Your Part you and your descendants after you
 - Circumcision as a sign vs 11
 - 8 days after birth, every male child, bond or free vs 12
 - Everlasting covenant vs 13
 - No circumcision, no covenant blessings vs 14
 - v. Sarah and Isaac are included
 - Change of her name from Sarai to Sarah vs 15
 - Blessing her I will bless her and also give you a son by her; then I will bless her, and she shall be a mother of nations; kings of peoples shall be from her
 - What about Ishmael?
 - i. No, Sarah your wife shall bear you a son, and you shall call his name Isaac; I will establish My covenant with him for an everlasting covenant, and with his descendants after him.
 - ii. as for Ishmael, I have heard you. Behold, I have blessed him, and will make him fruitful, and will multiply him exceedingly. He shall beget twelve princes, and I will make him a great nation.
 - iii. But My covenant I will establish with Isaac, whom Sarah shall bear to you at this set time next year."
 - vi. Abraham Obeyed vs 23-27
