 - 1. The Jews in exile had to wait for the crushing defeat of Babylon by the Medes and Persians in 539 B.C. 2:6-20 Dan. 5:1ff
 - 2. God's people had to wait many centuries for the Messiah's advent. Ga. 4:4
 - 3. We have to wait patiently for the return of Christ and the final judgment of the wicked. Heb. 10:32-29 Rev. 18:2 21:4 Rom. 8:18 2 Co. 4:17ff 2 Pet. 3:3-9

III. Those who are arrogant will die in their unbelief. v. 4ab,5

- A. Those who are proud wickedly oppose God.
 - 1. Pride is the opposite of faith. v. 4ab Pr. 21:24
 - a. The Babylonians exalt themselves. v. 4a 1:7b,11c,15d-16a Js. 4:6
 - b. They are inwardly perverse. v. 4b Mark 7:21-23 Ecc. 7:29 Deut. 32:4
 - 2. The greedy man who is addicted to evil will never be satisfied. v. 5 Jer. 51:7 Isa. 9:20 55:1ff 5:16 Ecc. 1:8 5:10 Pr. 30:15-16
- B. Those who are proud will perish in their unbelief. v. 6-20 <u>Isa. 13:11</u> <u>I Pet. 5:5</u> <u>Js. 4:6</u> Dan. 5:1ff

IV. Those who humbly believe God will live. v. 4c

- A. This is the answer to Habakkuk's question about the problem of evil.
 - 1. Rely upon God in spite of circumstances and appearances. Heb. 10:37-11:1
 - 2. In what sense will Habakkuk and other remaining believers "live" through the destruction by the Babylonians? 1:12c Heb. 11:39,13
 - 3. Faith has always been the only way men could be right with God. Ge. 15:6 Ro. 4:1ff
 - 4. Trust God because He is faithful. Deut. 32:4 Ps. 119:138,90,86,75
- B. You are justified before God by faith alone. Rom. 1:16-17 10:9f Gal. 3:10-11
 - 1. Paul quotes Habakkuk as he explains how a person can be right with God.
 - 2. You have no righteousness of your own. Rom. 3:10-18,23 6:23 Eph. 2:1-3
 - 3. You cannot gain life by your (proud) works. Ro. 3:20 <u>Ga. 3:10-11</u> 2:16 <u>Eph. 2:9</u> Luke 18:12-13 Phil. 3:3ff

- 4. You can only be saved through humble faith (alone) in Christ (alone), through whose finished work God declares sinners righteous. Ro. 3:21-28 5:1ff Phil. 3:9 Jo. 3:16 II Co. 5:21 I Pe. 3:18 Isa. 53:4-6,11 Gal. 3:13 Luke 18:13-14
- 5. God gives you life by His grace (alone). Eph. 2:4-9 Isa. 55:3 Amos 5:4,6 Jer. 23:6
- 6. There is not, nor has there ever been, another way to be right with God. <u>Heb. 11:5</u> Jo. 14:6 Acts 4:12 <u>Ga. 3:6-9</u> Gen. 15:6 Rom. 4:1-3,6-8,16 Ga. 3:9 Ps. 32:1-2
- 7. God offers life to all who believe. Rom. 1:16-17
- C. You continue to live by faith.
 - 1. Believing is not merely a one-time event, but rather it is the beginning of a life of trusting God. II Co. 5:17 Ezek. 36:25-27 Heb. 11:2ff Phil. 1:6
 - 2. Faith is central in your sanctification. Ga. 3:3 Col. 2:20-23
 - 3. Don't regress to living in sinful (proud) unbelief. Ro. 6:1 14:23 Ga. 6:7 Heb. 3:19
 - 4. A heart of faith produces a remarkable life of obedient faith. Heb. 10:38-11:40 Eph. 2:10 James 2:21-24f
 - 5. Faith will enable you to endure hard times. <u>Heb. 11:13-16,35-40</u> Ro. 5:1-5 2 Cor. 4:16-18 5:7 Luke 18:7
 - 6. Your faith will be richly rewarded. Heb. 11:6,13-16, 26, 39-40 Ps. 103:5
