Sermon: Leviticus 1:2-17

The burnt offering is the foundation for all other worship and life, because it is a picture of total dedication of the total person.

We see:

- 1. The cost of the "victim" means that all God's people are able to give their best, because God gives His "Best" as a "victim."
- 2. The procedures (ritual) in the burnt offering shows the "victim" presented to God in the place of the sinner.
- 3. The total and continuous burning shows that every part of life, every day, is totally dedicated to God.


