God's Love Perfected In Us (1John 2:3-6)

Introduction: Having God's love perfected in us greatly expands our hearts.

Exposition

1. What does it mean to have fellowship with God?

(a) "We know Him" (2:3, 4)

"This is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent" (John 17:3).

(b) "Truly the love of God is perfected in him" (2:5a)

"If we love one another, God abides in us, and His love has been perfected in us. ... [And] We love Him because He first loved us" (1John 4:12, 19).

(c) "We are in Him" (2:5b)

"I am the vine, you are the branches" (John 15:5).

(d) "He abides in Him" (2:6)

"Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me" (John 15:4).

2. How can we know we have fellowship with God?

(a) "If we keep his commandments" (2:3, 4)

It's our God's commanding. There are not mere words. It's our God speaking.

(b) "[If we keep] his word" (v. 5)

Loyalty is the proof of love (Deut 10:12-13, Rom 5, Eph 2, James 2, Matt 7:16, Hosea 4:1-2).

(c) "[If we] walk just as he walked" (v. 6)

"I delight to do Your will, O my God, And Your law is within my heart" (Ps 40:8, see John 15:12-13, John 13:13-14).

Application

1. Do you even know God's commandments?

"For this very reason, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue, to virtue knowledge, to knowledge self-control, to self-control perseverance, to perseverance godliness, to godliness brotherly kindness, and to brotherly kindness love.... Be even more diligent to make your call and election sure" (2Pe 1:5-10).

2. You may have to fight for assurance.

We are to "know that we know him," and that may require special diligence.

3. You have to come to God before you can obey.

Jesus says, "Without Me you can do nothing" (John 15:5).

"Such an efficacious governing knowledge of him, therefore, as, by the power of the love which it produces, subdues our souls to the obedience of him, is a certain proof to us of our union with him (1Jo 5:20) and relation to him" (Matthew Poole on 1Jn 2:5).
