Intro: Lest we forget!

- A. Do you consider yourself blessed with our inheritance? (2 Cor. 6:1)
 - 1. How many did go and do go without access to God's Word to man?
 - 2. How many will rise up in judgment against us? (Deut. 30:11-15)
- B. The devil's greatest strategy is to keep us from (believing) God's Words (Gen. 3:1-3)

Paul the Martyr's Confession and Testimony of Faith

Three Lessons and exhortations from Paul the Martyr

- A. HE IS READY TO GIVE HIS LIFE: VS. 6-8
 - 1. He knows his death as martyr is sealed (see vs. 16)
 - a. yet he is *now ready*
 - b. he sees his end as a *departure* (Hebrews 13:7)
 - c. reflected on his life with two speaking images
 - it was a good warfare
 - it was a strenuous race
 - d. his sees his death as a day of victory (vs. 8)
 - 2. What is Christ worth to you? Are we ready to face death like that?
- B. He openly shared his needs: vs. 9-21
 - 1. Paul wasn't shy to share his needs with his readers
 - 2. He shared his social needs: vs. 9, 21
 - 3. He shared his physical needs: vs. 13

- 4. He shared his spiritual needs: vs. 13b
- 5. He shared his deep emotional needs: vs. 14-16
- C. HE IS CONFIDENT OF HIS LORD: VS. 17-18
 - 1. Paul has faced a challenging foe: 17b, 16
 - a. as always, his foes have tried to shut his mouth
 - 2. His experience of God's faithfulness is his comfort for tomorrow
 - a. for tomorrow would again bring the fiercest challenge
 - not physical
 - but spiritual
 - b. yet Paul's tomorrow is in God's hands as his yesterday (Phil. 1:6)
 - c. this reliance of God and others is their greatest strength

Close: It is our duty to consider the 'great' in God's kingdom

- A. Our greatest example in Christ Himself (Hebrews 12:1-4; 1 Peter 2:21-25)
- B. But all Christ's followers are also worthy of our study (Heb. 13:7)
