# The Binding of Jesus John 18:12-14

#### I. Introduction

#### A. Review

- Jesus is now arrested—Judas has led a cohort of Romans along with officers from the Priests & Pharisees to Gethsemane
- 2. Jesus could have avoided them, but yields Himself into their hands

#### B. Active & Passive Obedience

- 1. Note the **distinction** of Christ's "active" & "passive" obedience:
  - a. His **active** obedience speaks of what He **does**—*i.e.* His **obeying** the **demands** of **law**, living a **holy**, **righteous**, **obedient** life
  - b. His **passive** obedience speaks of what's done **to** Him—*i.e.* His **suffering** the **penalty** for **our** violations & failure to **keep** the **law**
- It's somewhat artificial—for His sufferings were in obedience to a command, & His obedience was in the midst of His suffering
- But it's helpful in reminding us that more is needed for salvation than just the payment for sin—a positive, active righteousness is required
- 4. We've seen His active obedience—now His passive obedience!

## II. The Binding of Jesus

# A. Text Opened

- 1. Cp. Text—same band seen in Vs. 3, takes, binds & leads Him away
- 2. John adds a detail—before going to Caiaphas, He 1st goes to Annas
- Why? Consider the High Priest in that day:
  - a. Note: Judea was an occupied land, with a Roman governor
  - b. In absence of King, the H.P. is the local authority—Cp. Iraq
  - c. He serves at the whim of the Romans, who appoint & remove!
- 4. What does this have to do with Annas?
  - a. Annas was the 1<sup>st</sup> such H.P. appointee, by Quirinius, 7-15 AD
  - b. After He was deposed, he's followed by 3 sons in 3 years!
  - c. Then, His son-in-law, "Joseph Caiaphas", is appointed by Valerius Gratus (Pilate's predecessor) & serves from 18-36 AD!
  - d. After he was deposed, other sons of Annas followed—eventually, 5 sons, 1 grandson, & 1 son-in-law would be H.P.—Cp. Fords!
  - e. Cp. Lk. 3:1-2 & Acts 4:5-6—Caiaphas is H.P.; Annas the power!
- 5. Cp. Vs. 14—this Caiaphas is the same one in Jn. 11:49ff—unbiased?

### III. Application

### A. The Significance of Binding

- 1. Note "Typical" significance—Gen. 22:9—Isaac submits to Abraham!
- 2. Note "Sacerdotal" significance—sacrifice bound to altar—Ps. 118:27
- 3. So we see the full surrender & submission of Christ into the hands of His enemies—to go where they take Him, endure what they give!

#### B. The Sinfulness of Sin

- 1. Note that we **see** the exceeding **sinfulness** of **man** here in all this!
- 2. Man, the **creature**, has His **Creator** in his **hands**—what will he **do**?
- 3. He'll betray the Innocent; bind his Liberator; humiliate his King;

- condemn the Just; injure his healer; murder his Messiah Savior!
- 4. In sum, it's the expression of all man's enmity towards his Maker, his rage towards his Sovereign, compressed into a few hours—sin!

#### B. The Course of Sin

- 1. Note **correspondence** in what He **receives** & what is **our** due!
- 2. In the **sequence** of things done to **Him**, we see our **own** history w/sin:
  - a. It begins w/betrayal—promising us happiness, fulfillment, joy, & life—but leaves us empty, miserable & wretched!
  - b. Then it **binds** us—promising us **freedom** (from **God!**), it **binds** us, leaving us **tied**, **shackeled** & **bound**—**slaves** to **Satan's** desires!
  - Then it condemns us, mocks us, humiliates & denigrates us,
    & eventually, it destroys us—when finished, it brings forth death
- 3. **His** history is compressed **recapitulation** of **our** history & experience

## C. The Judgment of Sin

- 1. This **correspondence** also means that what **happened** to **Him**, **should** have **happened** to **us**! This is what **judgment** on sin **looks** like!
- 2. **Judgment** is to have every **mercy**, every **grace**, every **comfort**, every **compassion**, everything that makes life **life**, **removed** from us!
- 3. This is God's judgment on His Son! So shall it be when the heavens remove & mighty men flee—when judgment w/o mercy is rendered!
- 4. **Will** God not **do** it? The **fact** that He judged the **sin** laid upon His **Son** is **guarantee** of **your** judgment if you **die** in **your** sins!

## D. The Death of Sin

- Never forget: All that He experienced, all that He endured, was done so His people—those who believe in Him—might not endure it!
- 2. He's condemned—we, justified! He's humiliated—we, glorified! He's beaten—we, healed; He's cursed—we, blest; He dies—we, live
- Finally, as in our text—He is bound that we might be set free!
- Line from "Chariots of Fire"—Sam Gianni to Erick Little's friend & trainor—"Don't lose him; you'll never find another one like him!"
- Sinner! You'll never find another like Him! Never another so exactly fitted & tailored to your precise need before God
- 6. Never another who would or could do for you what must be done if your soul be saved! Don't let Him slip away or pass you by!
