- B. Faithful pastors feed the sheep with knowledge and understanding

- 2. Feeding practices

IV. Application: The duties of Christians who wish to withstand wind and tide

- A. The first duty of Christians to search out a faithful ministry and to join themselves to it.
- B. The second duty of Christians is to biblically submit themselves to such a ministry Heb. 13:17
- C. The third duty of Christians is to pray for and support such a ministry
