C. Components of Biblical Covenants (Exodus 20)

The Lord's covenant with his human servants is a bond of interpersonal commitment involving exclusive loyalty, sovereignly instituted by the Lord, expressed through mutual obligations and enforced by life-or-death consequences.<sup>2</sup>

- Exclusive loyalty Exodus 20:3
- Obligations
  - Commands to servants Exodus 20:4-17
  - Promises from the Lord Exodus 20:4-5
- Consequences
  - Blessings Exodus 20:12
  - Curses Exodus 20:5, 7

8:6; 12:24; see 1:1-4; 4:14-16)

## Take-Aways

- 1. Read your Bible *personally, relationally*. It's all about our Creator's covenant commitment to us, and our appropriate response of whole-hearted commitment to him.
  - Biblical doctrine is, at its core, an unveiling of the triune God, and specifically of Christ who announced: "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." (John 14:6)
  - Commands are not merely summons to keep rules. Obedience is interpersonal love and loyalty made visible in action.
- 2. As you read your Bible, be on the lookout for *Christ, the only mediator*, who secures your place in God's covenant love.
