²⁷ Now these are the generations of Terah. Terah fathered Abram, Nahor, and Haran; and Haran fathered Lot. ²⁸ Haran died in the presence of his father Terah in the land of his kindred, in Ur of the Chaldeans. ²⁹ And Abram and Nahor took wives. The name of Abram's wife was Sarai, and the name of Nahor's wife, Milcah the daughter of Haran the father of Milcah and Iscah. ³⁰ Now Sarai was barren; she had no child. ³¹ Terah took Abram his son and Lot the son of Haran, his grandson, and Sarai his daughter-in-law, his son Abram's wife, and they went forth together from Ur of the Chaldeans to go into the land of Canaan, but when they came to Haran, they settled there.³² The days of Terah were 205 years, and Terah died in Haran. 'Twas grace that taught my heart to fear, And grace my fears relieved; How precious did that grace appear The hour I first believed.


Through many dangers, toils and snares, I have already come; 'Tis grace hath brought me safe thus far, And grace will lead me home.

- Leave...
- Why... God's amazing promises
- Where ... will show you

From Macro to Micro, Genesis 11

- Ur, about 2100 BC
 - \circ $\,$ One of the world's great cities in its day
 - o 24,000 people
 - The people of ancient Ur were highly advanced culture. The common district was filled with marketplaces, schools, libraries, and many of the people were very wealthy. People had very nice homes with lush gardens and many conveniences.
 - Ziggurat (still stands); Nanna (aka Sin) had his home on top
- The Bible shifts its focus
 - Global.... To local
- This call to Abraham
- Events, though to a single family, have a cosmic significance
- Genesis 12-50 shares with us the story of a real family... we read about births and deaths, marriages and family quarrels, times of triumph and tragedy... it is the everyday life of one family, yet a story with universal significance for the whole world.
- Fascinating... how episodes in Abraham's life- how many days...

Why Abraham... why now?

- Our Genesis 10-11 Tower of Babel world.
 - o Abraham lived in a thoroughly pagan environment, both in Ur and in Canaan
 - The pre-Abrahamic, non-Shemite culture. Humans rebelling against God
 - Defying God's command
 - Making a name for themselves
 - Making up their own religion
 - The Canaanite cesspool of sin
 - Derek Kidner's summary: "The primeval history reaches its fruitless climax as man, conscious of new abilities, prepares to glorify and fortify himself by collective effort. The elements of the story are timelessly characteristic of the spirit of the world. The project is typically grandiose. Men describe it excitedly to one another, as if it were the ultimate achievement, very much as modern man glories in his space project. At the same time they betrayed their insecurity as they crowd together to preserve their identity and control their fortunes."
- Book of Shem: God's faithfulness to his promises to Noah... 11.10-26

- The role of grace-based choice
- Terah, after all this, is an idolater
- One of the key figures in history
- Revered by Jews, Muslims, Christians
- Stunning example of grace, 11.27-12.4a
 - A gospel illustration
 - Faith in the Promises of God.
 - The Promises of God looking forward to what God is going to do for his glory through Jesus Christ
 - Babel- did not believe the promises of God
 - Children of the Promise to Abraham... Acts 2.39: For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself.
- Abraham knew the story of Babel
- Hallowed be thy Name focused- makes much of God's name; at Babel, made much of their own names
- Look for our identity in God/Christ
 - \circ $\;$ Babel- world looking for identity within- their creativity, power, live life their way
 - John Calvin: "For the plague of submitting to our own rule leads us straight to ruin."
 - Jen Oshman: Like the alluring but destructive creatures in Greek mythology, self is a Siren. We are indeed attracted to ourselves. But rooting ourselves in ourselves has led to our ruin. The I-can-do-this self-talk and building ourselves up from the inside has exhausted us. We see now that there is no rest for the one who depends on herself for everything. Our current crisis condition is not what the giver of life intended. He created us in a specific way, for a specific purpose. And he intended that we be energized and filled with joy in a relationship with him. Let's admit that we are not enough, and turn to the God who is.
 - o Our identity is to be found in our relationship with Christ
- Called the Friend of God, II Chronicles 20.7; Isaiah 41.8; James 2.23
- God's concern for the nations
- Uncanny ability to see the unseen
 - \circ 20/20 vision in looking for a city
 - In a world where what we see can be so discouraging and so disheartening
 - o Pilgrim mentality
- One of the greatest examples of faith and walking by faith in a world where his family was not and his city was not
 - Showed his faith by obedience... at Babel they showed they had no faith by disobedience
- Ultimately, depends on God's faithfulness
 - o Abraham will stumble and fall... and God will pick him back up
- He died satisfied

So What About Us?

- We are going to go on a long walk with Abraham
- Sir Isaac Newton: "If I have seen further it is by standing on the shoulders of giants." (In a 1675 letter to Robert Hooke)
 - Why we sang *For All the Saints*
- Not all a piece of cake
 - o The world in all its brokenness

- The nations in all their turmoil
- The key difference between us and the world... is God's amazing grace
- The key to walking by faith in this troubled world... is God's amazing grace
- The message from us for the world... is God's amazing grace
- The Promise for the future for us is beyond this world... is because of God's amazing grace
