05) Being the Body "Doing to One Another"

INTRODUCTION

- the importance of love in the building up of the body; expressed in what we think, say, and now do to one another

EXPOSITION

I. SERVE ONE ANOTHER – 1Peter 4:10

- Gk. diakoneo = serve, wait on, care for, provide for
- 1.) Service is a stewardship each has been given a gift for the purpose of serving
- 2.) Service is to work with God an application of God's manifold grace; 1Cor3:9; 2Cor6:1
- 3.) Service is for the glory of God v.11
- Mk10:45 expression of Christ-likeness; showing what Christ is like

II. SUBMIT TO ONE ANOTHER – Galatians 5:13

- Gk. douleuo = be a slave, be subjected to; to serve as a servant
- Eph5:21 (Gk. hupotaso) = place oneself in subjection; be under authority; in the fear of God (not disconnected)
- 1.) This submission is one of the purposes of our liberation v.13
- 2.) This submission is one of love, not slavish and grudging service v.13
- 3.) This submission is the key to greatness in the Kingdom Mk10:44
- As we are servants of Christ, so we are servants of His body

III. CONSIDER ONE ANOTHER - Heb 10:24

- Gk. katanoeo = think about, notice, observe, be aware of, consider closely, be concerned about, examine
- Act11:6 Peter carefully looks at the sheet; Ps119:15 to meditate and *contemplate* God's ways
- The purpose is to pay attention to others to stir up love and good works in ourselves and in them (v.25)

IV. SYMPATHIZE WITH ONE ANOTHER - 1Pet3:8

- Gk. sumpathays (*compassion*) = sum/pathay with/feelings, emotions, desires
 - Rom12:15 weep/rejoice with others; 1Cor12:26 members suffer, rejoice; Heb13:3 prisoners
 - This takes mental energy, and entering into one anothers' life; a-pathy lack of lack of emotion/feeling/concern

V. PRAY FOR ONE ANOTHER – James 5:16

- Gk. euxomai = a strong wish which moves one to prayer; to so desire something to move to ask the Sovereign
 - Gal6:2 (Gk. bastadzo) support, sustain, help carry, pick up; (Gk. baros) = burden, weight
 - That in relation to the sins of others, and the humble dealing with them

VI. FORGIVE ONE ANOTHER - Ephesians 4:32

- Gk. charidzomai = forgive, cancel a debt, give generously
 - The standard and paradigm is Christ's forgiveness; one reason some are so stingy with forgiveness is that they have a skewed view of God's character
 - We are prone to think that God is quick to anger and slow in mercy, but it is the opposite Ps103:8
 - This is what we should be as parents, and with one another

VII. ENDURE ONE ANOTHER – Ephesians 4:2

- <u>Gk. anechomai</u> = endure, be patient, especially in light of difficulty (i.e. when things aren't easy)
- This done with Gk. makrothumia = a state of emotional calm in the face of difficulty, without complaint or irritation
 - This includes humility, gentleness, etc.; The desire of this is unity in the Spirit with peace

VIII. RECEIVE ONE ANOTHER - Romans 15:7

- Gk. proslambanomai welcome, receive, take hold of with friendliness; begins in the heart, but expressed outwardly
- As human beings, God has connected our heart with behavior, and it should reflect it
 - Illustration: "I'm so happy" with the same expression as "I'm so mad"; rejoicing, especially in Psalms is connected to loud singing, clapping of hands, etc.; sadness is related to a fallen countenance
 - Prov15:13; 25:23; 27:17 sharpening of countenance
- Rom16:16 Gk. philayma, from phileo; it is a "holy" kiss, not carnal or titilating (to excite); 1Cor16:20; 2Cor13:12; 1Thes5:26
- 1Peter 5:14 (Gk. en philaymati agapays) a kiss of love, an agape kiss;

APPLICATION

- Believers: we do all of this, because as believers this is what Christ has done to us; it is by being consumed with that that we are enabled to do these things to others

- Unbelievers: this is what God offers you in the Gospel if you come to the Lord Jesus
