To Seek and To Save Luke 15:11-32 Pastor McMorris

Review:

Christ's parable, known to us at the parable of the "prodigal son" was a powerful lesson that Christ used to communicate truth to both sinners and scribes. In this parable, Christ makes clear His Father's intention to seek and to save sinners; His loving heart for a repentant sinner; and his desire for those trapped in legalistic Pharisaism to turn to Him.
