How ought we to respond to such a Being?

***Point:** What makes gratitude Biblical depends on what you do with God's blessings. If you reject or forget them, you are deemed to be ungrateful. But if you recognize them and give due appreciation to God for them, you exercise Biblical gratitude!

In Everything, v. 18a

Does this verse mean we are called to give thanks *FOR* everything?

Gordon Fee wrote, "It is especially important to note that the modifier in this case does not say "for all things," but "in all circumstances." It is neither reasonable nor biblical piety to imagine that God wishes his children to be thankful for all things that befall them, good or ill." (*The First and Second Letters to the Thessalonians*. NICNT, p. 215)

Think of Joseph (Gen. 37:14, 28; 39:4-5; 41:40; 50:19-21)...

*Point

1. This is the heart of Gratitude. When we come to see God's hand in all things- and so His work, His sovereign care, His love, grace, and compassion- we learn to give thanks in all things. To do otherwise as Christians is to plunge ourselves into spiritual depression (cf. Ps. 78)...
 - a. How could God's people rebel against God after the Lord gave them so much Redemptive care? (cf. Ps. 78:10-11, 41-42)...
 - b. Rather than recognizing and so appreciating God's many blessings, the people of God during the time of the Exodus took their eyes off of the Lord and placed them on the things in their life which fell short of their wants, desires, and expectations. When they did this, they grieved God, rebelled against His goodness, and so fell into grumbling and complaining!
2. The health of our walk with Christ depends largely on whether or not we celebrate God's blessings. That is why when it came to a Healthy Relationship with God, Paul lastly exhorted the Thessalonians, "In everything give thanks!" This is one of the two most important virtues we can possess as children of God (the other being love for God)!

*Where We Live

1. Are God's blessing a cause of celebration for you? Or has your heart grown cold/indifferent to God and His grace?
2. How do we cultivate a heart of gratitude? Look at the text before us... we have in this passage the key when it comes to a grateful disposition.
