3. Pray in _____ . Romans 8:26-27 ...

- The Spirit doesn't pray through us in some indiscernible prayer language; the Spirit prays for us with a kind of groaning that cannot be audibilized.
- So pray _____ ... because your prayers are being shaped by the Spirit of God to conform to the will of God.
- The Bible is inspired by the Spirit, and in a very real sense, it is the Spirit's prayer book.
