Grant Van Leuven

Intro:

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8th rule of rightly understanding M.L.: <u>WLC Q&A 99:8</u>. We are responsible *to* others to obey God.

Main Point of Text: Elders are servants to help fellow-Christians joyfully stand by faith.

Sermon Point: Be helpful.

Move 1: Do not support sin in your superiors.

LC: "... we are to take heed of partaking with others in what is forbidden them":

- Lay hands suddenly on no man, <u>neither be partaker of other men's sins</u>: keep thyself pure. (1 Tim. 5:22).
- Chapter's "title": "Duties toward believers". Honor position and responsibilities.
- But be careful not to hastily ordain a man who will prove to be a hindrance rather than a helper.
- And <u>have no fellowship with the unfruitful works</u> of darkness, but rather <u>reprove them</u>. (Eph. 5:11)

Move 2: But support everyone in doing their duty to Jesus.

LC: "... what is commanded to others, we are bound, according to our places and callings, to be helpful to them ...": <u>2 Corinthians 1:24</u>. Context: Paul had been tough on them, but delayed arrival to help them catch conviction:

- Wants them to understand he is a "doulos" of Christ and them: "Not ... have dominion".
- Wanted them to understand his rule was to help them: Greek, "fellow-workers".
- If they can accept, it will help them stand by their faith (conviction/commitment) and thus have joy.
- WCF 16:2: " ... by [good works] believers manifest thankfulness, strengthen their assurance, edify their brethren ..." Result: **joy**.
- <u>READ Hebrews 13:7, 17.</u> Don't deny elders joy. Nor you joy that comes with helping.
- <u>READ 1 Peter 5:1-8.</u> Devil wants to steal your joy. You all have a role to play in disappointing him.

Conclusion:

Know your roles to Christ and His Church.
