## A Challenge to America's Christians

Two hundred and twenty-two years ago this this 4<sup>th</sup> of July, our forefathers signed the Declaration of Independence announcing to the world that a new nation had been born.

The United States of America was unlike any nation in the world in that it was founded upon faith in God.

The Declaration of Independence states "we believe these truths to be self-evident." This is a statement of faith.

Furthermore, the Declaration declares and accepts the Biblical truth that the Creator is no respecter of persons, that indeed "all men are created equal."

The Declaration then says that mankind has been given rights by the Creator. All the rights are not listed but the most fundamental rights are the right *to life-liberty and the pursuit of happiness*.

This simple yet profound statement of faith has brought hope to millions of oppressed and downtrodden people the world over.

They know that America's faith in the God given rights of mankind can defeat the strongest armies, break the grip of evil empires and shatter the highest wall that separates freedom from slavery.

No nation has inspired hope, provided opportunity and fulfilled dreams like the United States of America.

The prophetic statement of our puritan forefather John Winthrop has come to pass "we shall be a city on a hill, a light to the world" he said.

Still today, the Statue of Liberty holds that light high. The inscribed message there "give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free" echoes the call of Jesus Christ who said, "come unto me all ye that labor and are heavy laden and I will give you rest."

Is it hard then to understand the words of Patrick Henry that "this great nation was founded on the gospel of Jesus Christ"?

Psalm 33:12 says: "Blessed is the nation whose God is the LORD."
The LORD was without doubt the God of our Fathers. George Washington said, "it is impossible to govern without God and the Bible."

Thomas Jefferson said, "can liberties of a nation be secure when we have removed the conviction that those liberties are the gift of God"?

Why has America been so blessed, why has the United States been prosperous above all nations? Simply my friends, because the United States was built upon faith in God and the Bible.

Today, those of us who understand that God is the source of our strength are greatly troubled. Even among those who reject the God of our fathers, there is an uneasiness that in spite of our present prosperity something is going wrong in our beloved nation, that the foundations of our house are being eaten away by some unidentified vermin.

As people of God we know what that vermin is. As children of the light we see in the dark corners and in the hidden underpinnings the steady eating away, the non-stop devouring of the very mortar and stone that was laid by our Christian founders. That vermin is the ungodly sins that have been allowed to flourish in our country.

In the past when sins were committed they were identified as sins even by the sinner. It was expected that sinners were to repent.

Today sins are called rights, today sins are called alternative lifestyles, today sins are made legal and have the protection of laws, today sins have

become virtues while virtues have become sins. God says in Isaiah 5:20: "Woe to those who call evil good and good evil."

When our forefathers wrote the preamble to the Constitution of the Unites States they said that it was for them and for their posterity. You and I are their posterity. They paid for our freedom in blood.

Young lives by the thousands have been sacrificed that you and I could sit here today as free people.

The hopes and dreams of countless American boys were given up on battlefields so that you and I could have the freedom to experience ours. This sacrifice of American blood deserves better than what we are allowing in our nation today.

Are we worthy to be the posterity of our patriotic God-fearing forefathers? Are we worth the blood of the youth of past generations that was poured out for us?

It seems that this generation of Christians has forgotten not only the blood shed by our forefathers but even the blood shed by Christ for our sins.
