## II. Remember from where you have come. v. 8

- A. Before you did not know God. v. 8a
  - 1. It is not that they didn't believe in a deity (or deities). Ro. 1:19-23 Acts 17:16,22
  - 2. They did not believe in the one true God nor did they have any relationship with Him. They were far off. Eph. 2:11-12 4:18
  - 3. You cannot know God through false religion.
- B. You were slaves to your false gods. v. 8b
  - 1. Those who have false beliefs about God are, in a sense, atheists.
  - 2. In effect, they offer worship to demons. <u>1 Co. 10:19-20</u> 8:4-5 Dt. 32:17 <u>Isa. 1:13-15</u>
  - 3. What does this say about the civil idea of religion which states that all religions (Mormons, Catholics, Jews, Muslims and Evangelicals) worship the same god?
  - 4. Not all religion is a good thing. Jer. 2:13 Acts 17:22
  - 5. False religion is enslaving. 4:25
- C. Do you remember from where you came?

## III. Then you came to know God. v. 9a

- A. You turned away from your former idols (demons). 1:4 1 Th. 1:9-10 1 Co. 12:2 Acts 14:15
  - 1. Unbelievers think that to become a Christian is to go from freedom to slavery, but the realty is that the gospel sets you free. 4:3
  - 2. From what idols have you turned (repented)? Isa. 55:1-2 Ezek. 14:4,7 Col. 2:23
  - 3. What does it look like to turn from your idols? Acts 19:19
- B. Conversion is described as knowing God.
  - 1. You did not merely learn some facts about God one can know a lot about God without actually knowing God. Js. 2:19 Mt. 7:21-23
  - 2. You came to a true understanding of God and entered into a personal relationship with Him. John 17:3 10:14
  - 3. The only way you can know God is through faith in Jesus Christ. 2:16 John 14:6
    Acts 4:12 Mt. 7:13-14
- C. You are known by God. <u>John 10:27-28,14</u> 1 Co. 8:3 1 Tim. 2:19 Ps. 139:1 Is. 65:1 Ex. 33:17
  - 1. He knew and loved you before you knew and loved Him. 1:15 Jer. 1:5 Eph. 1:3ff Rom. 8:29-30 <u>1 Jo. 4:19</u> Gen. 18:19 <u>John 6:44</u>
  - 2. You are precious to Him. Isa.  $62:4-5\overline{61:10}$
- D. You enjoy great privileges and blessings. 2:16 3:24,7
  - 1. You are adopted sons of God. 4:5b 3:7
  - 2. The Holy Spirit indwells your heart. 4:6 3:2-5 5:22-24 Ro. 8:13-14 Joel 2:28-32
  - 3. You are heirs of God's promises. 3:29,18 4:7 Ro. 4:13 1 Pe. 1:4 Eph. 1:11,14,18
- E. Those who truly know God are transformed by Him. 1 Co. 6:9ff 1 Pe. 2:2f Eph. 2:18

# IV. Why would you want to go back to slavery? v. 9b-10

- A. To what exactly are they going back?
  - 1. Before, they were in bondage to their old pagan religious systems.
  - 2. Now they are being persuaded to use the Mosaic law as a means of justifying themselves.
  - 3. These religious systems are weak, worthless and enslaving. Col. 2:20 Ro. 10:3
  - 4. The gospel has moved us past these elementary things. 4:3 Col. 2:20-23
- B. Paul now adds the legalistic observance of holy days to circumcision as barriers to gospel faith. 2:3 5:2 Num. 28:11ff Lev. 23:1ff Col. 2:17-23
  - 1. What is wrong with observing Passover and other Jewish holy days?
  - 2. With the coming of Christ, the ceremonial law has been fulfilled. 1 Cor. 5:7 Heb. 10:10,14 8:13
  - 3. Are there any conditions under which it would be appropriate for someone to observe Passover or other Jewish holy days? Rom. 14:4ff
  - 4. What would you say to those who teach that Jewish holy days should still be observed by Messianic Jews? Eph. 2:11ff Acts 20:16
  - 5. Other religions also observe certain days.
  - 6. What about Christian holy days? Rom. 14:4-6 Col. 2:16
  - 7. Extrabiblical religious observances actually create a barrier between men and God. John 4:21-24 Col. 2:23
