Main Point:

Selfishness is the source of your strife with others and with God; therefore, instead of continuing in your selfishness, humble yourself before the Lord.

1. Selfishness leads to strife in your relationships with others.

2. Selfishness leads to strife in your relationship with God as well.

3. This is serious, but God gives grace to those who repent.

4. Instead of continuing in your selfishness, humble yourself before the Lord.
