### **Bearers of the Truth**

"You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor."

1. All Truth is G	God's Truth.
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2. He's Made Us to Represent Him and Others Truly.

3. Jesus Has Conquered Deceit with Truth.

CONCLUSION: God is the God of truth. In Him is nothing false at all. As sovereign over all Creation, He will have everyone know the truth that He alone is Lord of All. He has made us to be ambassadors of His Kingdom to bear the truth throughout all the earth and especially to our neighbors. Believing the truth about who Jesus is, and how He has lived out the truth of His redeeming love for us at the cross, is central to what it means to be part of His nation of priests. Let us proclaim the truth of Jesus Christ in our thoughts, words, and lives!

### Westminster Larger Catechism

**Q.** 144. What are the *duties required* in the ninth commandment?

**A.** The *duties required* in the ninth commandment are, the preserving and promoting of truth between man and man, and the good name of our neighbor, as well as our own: appearing and standing for the truth; and from the heart, sincerely, freely, clearly, and fully, speaking the truth, and only the truth, in matters of judgment and justice, and in all other things whatsoever; a charitable esteem of our neighbors; loving, desiring, and rejoicing in their good name; sorrowing for, and covering of their infirmities; freely acknowledging of their gifts and graces, defending their innocency; a ready receiving of good report, and unwillingness to admit of an evil report, concerning them; discouraging tale-bearers, flatterers, and slanderers; love and care of our own good name, and defending it when need requireth; keeping of lawful promises; study and practising of whatsoever things are true, honest, lovely, and of good report.

**Q.** 145. What are the *sins forbidden* in the ninth commandment?

**A.** The sins forbidden in the ninth commandment are, all prejudicing the truth, and the good name of our neighbors, as well as our own, especially in public judicature; giving false evidence; suborning false witnesses; wittingly appearing and pleading for an evil cause; outfacing and overbearing the truth; passing unjust sentence; calling evil good, and good evil; rewarding the wicked according to the work of the righteous, and the righteous according to the work of the wicked; forgery; concealing the truth; undue silence in a just cause, and holding our peace when iniquity calleth for either a reproof from ourselves, or complaint to others; speaking the truth unseasonably, or maliciously to a wrong end, or perverting it to a wrong meaning, or in doubtful and equivocal expressions, to the prejudice of truth or justice; speaking untruth, lying, slandering, backbiting, detracting, tale-bearing, whispering, scoffing, reviling, rash, harsh, and partial censuring; misconstructing intentions, words, and actions; flattering, vain-glorious boasting, thinking or speaking too highly or too meanly of ourselves or others; denying the gifts and graces of God; aggravating smaller faults; hiding, excusing, or extenuating of sins, when called to a free confession; unnecessary discovering of infirmities; raising false rumours, receiving and countenancing evil reports, and stopping our ears against just defence; evil suspicion; envying or grieving at the deserved credit of any, endeavouring or desiring to impair it, rejoicing in their disgrace and infamy; scornful contempt; fond admiration; breach of lawful promises; neglecting such things as are of good report; and practicing or not avoiding ourselves, or not hindering what we can in others, such things as procure an ill name.

READ Exodus 19:4-6; 20:16; John 14:1-17; Revelation 1:4-7; James 3:1-12; Psalm 34:11-14; 119:113-128. DISCUSS How do you view stuff, time, ideas in relationship to Christ's Kingdom? Why? MEDITATE on John 14:6 and Westminster Larger Catechism #144-5.

PRAY EACH DAY THIS WEEK "God of Truth, there is not the slightest falsity in You. Please teach us how important it is, as Your representatives, to think, speak, and live out the truthfulness of who You are. The lies of Satan are constantly calling Your truth into question. Enable us to believe what You say completely. Amen."

#### **Monday**

READ Exodus 20:16; Exodus 19:4-6; Revelation 1:4-7; Psalm 119:113-128. DISCUSS What does it mean for us to *represent God as His priests*? What role does truth or deception have in this? SERVE Reach out to someone in need! MEDITATE on John 14:6 with WLC #144-5.

#### **Tuesday**

READ Exodus 20:16; John 14:1-17; Psalm 34:11-14; 119:113-128. DISCUSS How does relate truth to each person of the Trinity? Why is truth such a vital part of God's character? What does that say about we ought to live as His people? SERVE Live out the truthfulness of Christ by demonstrating care to someone in His name. MEDITATE on John 14:6 with WLC #144-5.

Optional Alternate Prayer "Lord God, all that You say is true and right. With the psalmist we cry out, 'Teach me Your way, O LORD, that I may walk in Your truth.' You tell us in Your Word, 'The LORD is near to all who call on him, to all who call on him in truth.' And we know, Jesus, that You are the truth in whom we call upon the Father when we pray in Your name. Enable us to be truth-tellers and faithful ambassadors for Your Kingdom. Teach us to represent You truthfully and to believe Your Word with the whole of our lives. Amen."

#### Wednesday

READ Exodus 20:16; First Kings 17:17-24; John 14:1-17; Psalm 119:113-128. DISCUSS How does our truthfulness or falseness reflect upon God? How are you glorifying Christ in your truthfulness? MEDITATE on John 14:6 with WLC #144-5.

#### **Thursday**

READ **Exodus 20:16**; **James 3:1-12**; **Psalm 119:113-128**. DISCUSS Why is the tongue so difficult to control? How does deceit lead to death? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own!* **MEDITATE** on **John 14:6** with WLC #144-5.

### **Friday**

READ Exodus 19:4-6; 20:16; John 14:1-17; Revelation 1:4-7; James 3:1-12; Psalm 34:11-14; 119:113-128. DISCUSS What has God been teaching you this week? SERVE by *caring for someone in need!* MEDITATE on John 14:6 with WLC #144-5.
