

These brief moments in the upper room are the calm before the storm of Jesus’ suffering

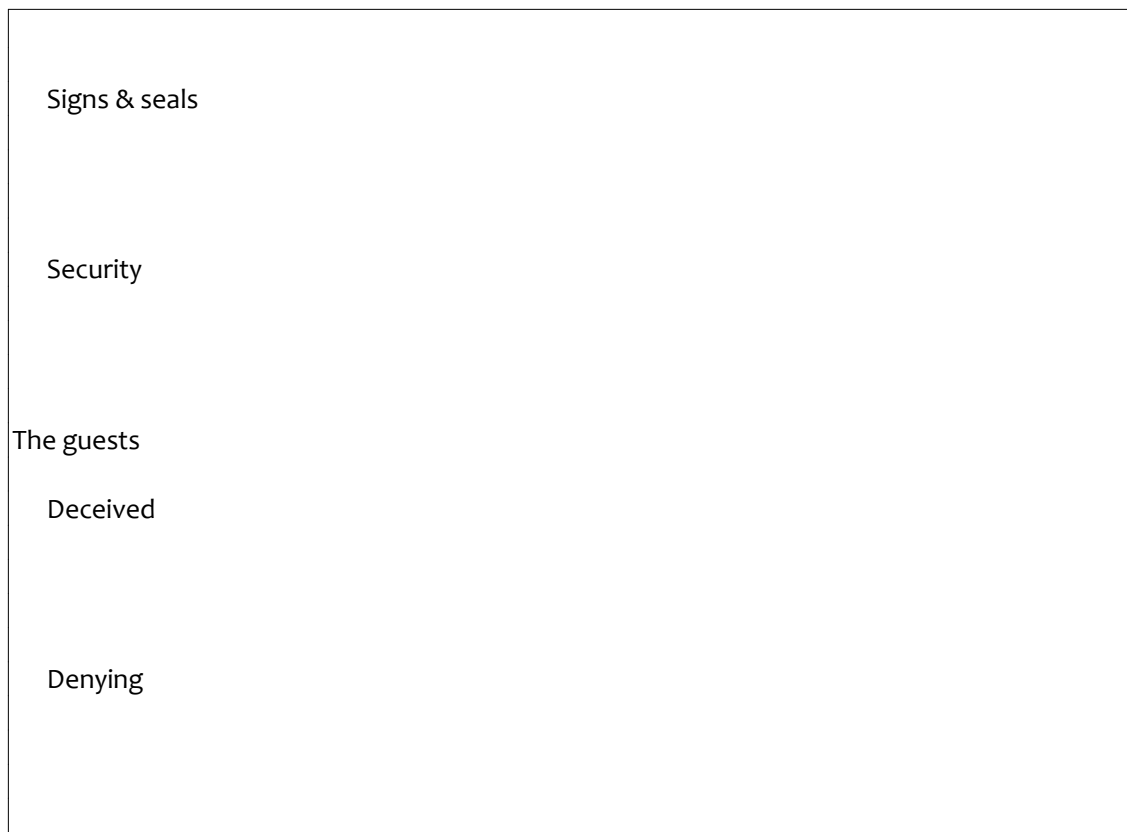
