Friends and Foes

2 Timothy 4:9-22

Mentors

- Many great Christian leaders have had a spiritual mentor
 - for Timothy, that person was Paul
 - special care, teaching, setting a high example
- Mentorship is a two-way street
 - my true child in the faith... my beloved child
 - it seems apparent that Paul has no other earthly friend who is as dear to him as Timothy
 - *I have no one like him* (Phil 2:19-20)
 - Timothy not only adheres to Paul's doctrine, he follows Paul's example
 - a faithful, dependable coworker and partner in the gospel
- Paul longs to see Timothy once more before his life on earth is over

Updates on Key Coworkers

- Crescens has gone to Galatia, presumably for the purpose of ministering there
- Titus has crossed the Adriadic Sea to go to Dalmatia
- Tychius is deployed to Ephesus, bringing Paul's letter and trading places with Timothy so Timothy can go to Rome
- Demas has deserted the ministry and gone to Thessalonica
 - Demas once showed great potential and was part of the inner circle of Paul's ministry team
 - Demas puts comfort and convenience above faithful gospel ministry
 - a great heartache for Paul
 - faith and faithfulness are things we must exercise and keep pursuing
 - those who commit to following Christ must count the cost
 - those who commit to following Jesus will always be on a collision course with worldly values

❖ On the plus side

- despite an earlier "hiccup" in their relationship, Paul now values the ministry of John Mark
- Mark, the missionary dropout, has skyrocketed from being useless to being useful to Paul and the cause of the gospel
- failure is not final, you can come back from disgrace

BTW...

- "Timothy, please bring a few necessary items along with you."
 - coat
 - books and parchments
 - possibly Paul's copy of the OT Scriptures and volumes that contain his own notes
 - perhaps material passed on to Mark and Luke that is useful to them in writing their gospels

A Foe

- ❖ A strong, urgent warning about Alexander, who shows his true colors as an enemy of the gospel
 - possibly the same Alexander as 1 Timothy 1:20
 - an out and out heretic
 - ringleader of a movement in Ephesus that is threatening to derail the church there
 - if this <u>is</u> the same Alexander, he may bear a grudge against Paul
 - Paul's words about him doling Paul great harm may suggest Alexander's role in getting Paul arrested
 - whoever this Alexander is, he has proved beyond a shadow of a doubt that he is an enemy of the gospel
- ❖ The Lord will repay him according to his deeds

Odds and Ends

- A final reminder of how the Lord stands with and undertakes for His servants in their times of need
 - Paul sees his personal experience through the lens of what Jesus experiences in His own suffering and death
 - desertion, deliverance, salvation, the Lord's nearness and the supreme power of God to persevere in it and prevail through it
- ❖ The Lord stands by and strengthens Paul so he can proclaim the gospel even in difficult circumstances
 - even in the face of death, Paul can boldly proclaim his confidence in Christ
 - no evil worked against God's people can keep them from the goals and purposes God has for them (*cf.* Romans 8:31-35)
- ❖ God does all this for His own glory (4:18)
- Final greetings for Priscilla, Aquila and the family of Onesiphorus
- Updates on Erastus and Trophinimus along with greetings from members of the church in Rome
- Final benediction: The Lord be with your spirit. Grace be with you.
