The Painful Joy of God's Purposes in the Christian's Life (1 Peter 1:6,7)

- OT: delight yourself in Lord (Ps 37) serve Him with gladness (Ps 100)
- NT: rejoice, leap for joy great is your reward in heaven (Luke 6:23)
- "I have spoken to you that your joy may be full" (John 15: 11)
- "Rejoice in the Lord" Phil 4:4 "the fruit of the Spirit is Joy" Gal 5
- Christianity: a life of tremendous joy but that joy is accompanied by grief

I. Two Reasons Why Christians Can Be Joyful

- 1. *The Promise of a glorious future*: "In this you greatly rejoice" in what?
 - v.3 "begotten again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus"
 - v.4 "inheritance incorruptible & undefiled preserved in heaven for you"
 - v.5 "kept by power of God through faith for salvation, ready to be revealed"
- In this 'We greatly rejoice' God keeps us for it & God keeps it for us
- 2. God's sovereign purpose in our Grief and Distress
- Peter says: trials are used by God to perfect us for the joy of salvation

II. God's Divine Purpose in our Grief and Distress

• V.6 "If needs be" v.7 "so that" – grief & distress happens if God wills it

III. Then Does God Will Our Suffering and Distress?

- Answer: yes & no. God doesn't will us to sin, but He controls all things
