WLC Q. 43. How doth Christ execute the office of a prophet? A. Christ executeth the office of a prophet, in his revealing to the Church in all ages, by his Spirit and Word, in divers ways of administration, the whole will of God, in all things concerning their edification and salvation. **WLC Q. 44.** How doth Christ execute the office of a priest? A. Christ execute th the office of a priest, in his once offering himself a sacrifice without spot to God, to be a reconciliation for the sins of his people; and in making continual intercession for them. **WLC Q. 45.** How doth Christ execute the office of a king? A.
