0	We must have anof forgiveness, where we forgive another person before God, whether or not they admit or even recognize any wrong.
	Mark 11.25 And whenever you stand praying, forgive, if you have anything against anyone, so that your Father also who is in heaven may forgive you your trespasses."
0	We must seekforgiveness, where we bring up the wrong that the person did, and if they repent, forgive them and be reconciled.
	<u>Luke 17.3–4</u> Pay attention to yourselves! If your brother sins, rebuke him, and if he repents, forgive him, 4 and if he sins against you seven times in the day, and turns to you seven times, saying, 'I repent,' you must forgive him."
