# Knowledge with Reverence I Corinthians 1:18-25

#### God's wisdom is:

**I.** Powerful –"It is the power of God"

(vs. 18-20)

God's wisdom can:

- A. Redeem "unto us which are saved"
- B. Ruin "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise"
- C. Reject "bring to nothing the understanding of the prudent"

II. Proffered – "it pleased God by... preaching"

(vs. 21-23)

God's wisdom comes with:

- A. Preaching "preaching to save them that believe"
- B. Proofs "Jews require a sign...Greeks seek wisdom"
- C. Prophesies "to the Jews a stumblingblock"

III. Personified – "Christ the power ... wisdom of God (vs. 24-25)

God's wisdom is more:

- A. Visible -"which are called, both Jews and Greeks"
- **B.** Virtuous "the foolishness of God is wiser"
- C. Valiant "weakness of God is stronger than men"

#### Sentence Sermon:

"Man is most wise when he bows to the wisdom of God."
