	needed for Benjamin (21:4-15).				
	b. Israel secures the final 200 virgins from a gathering				
		in Shiloh by them (2	21:16-24).		
	c. If you are confused at the wisdom of devoting the				
		tribe of Benjamin to destruction, only to then spare			
		Benjamin from utter destruction by sparing 600,			
	destroying the camp of Jabesh-Gilead to secure 400				
	virgins and stealing another 200 virgins from a				
	festival, the author shares your angst in 21:25, "In				
	those days there was no king in Israel. Everyone did				
		what was right in his	_ eyes."
