#### Birth ☞ Carnal Man

- Hebrews 10:18; Isaiah 53:11* - After Christ, there exists no act no sacrifice which is needed to satisfy the just demands of God.
- I John 2:1 & 2* – The Doctrine of Propitiation (total satisfaction) vs. Atonement (satisfaction for past actions). Nothing you do will make God love you more. Nothing you do will make God love you less.

## C. The Authority, Finality and Sufficiency of God's Word

### 2. Its Correct Use

- a. All experience is subject to the Word of God **II Cor 5:7; Heb 4:12** Two axioms  
If we experience “Yes” and God’s Word says “No” then we hold “No” to be true.  
If we experience “No” and God’s Word says “Yes” then we hold “Yes” to be true.
- b. Five Questions:
  - 1.) **New Covenant** (Hebrews 8:6, 7, 13; 9:15)  
vs. **Old Covenant** (Hebrews 9:1 – 7, 16 – 22; Matthew 5:17; Luke 24:27, 44)
    - a.) **Example: Old in New Luke and Zacharias – Luke 1:8-10**
    - b.) **Example: Old in New Luke and Holy Spirit – Luke 11:13**
    - c.) **Example: Old in Old Psalm 51:11**
    - d.) **Example: New in Old Isaiah 53:6, 11**
  - 2.) **Doctrine (I Timothy 4:6; Titus 1:9; 2:1, 7, 10)**  
vs. **Historical Revelation** (I Corinthians 10:11; Luke 1:1 – 4)
  - 3.) **Definition**
    - a. Words have meaning. Without introduction nor explanation God revealed himself through words, through the written word.
    - b. Interpretation is subject to definition
  - 4.) **Revealed vs. Hidden** (Deuteronomy 29:29)
    - a.) Higher (Isaiah 55:8 & 9)  
Example: Prophecy (II Peter 1:19 – 21; Example: Jeremiah 31:15 = Matthew 4:12 – 16)  
Example: Parable (Matthew 13:13 – 15 & 18) Conventional wisdom:  
Parables are meant to illustrate truth; Truth – they are meant to hide truth.
    - b.) Secret (Deuteronomy. 29:29; Acts 1:6 & 7; I Corinthians 2:11; John 21:25) “The Bible doesn’t say” single hardest statement of teacher
  - 5.) **Application:** Joshua 1:8; Ezra 7:10

## D. The Imminent Return of Christ – Philippians 4:5 (Ch/MnSt.P)

1. Rapture (Hebrews 9:28; Revelations 1:3; 22: 6, 7, 10, 12, 20)
2. Death (James 4:13 – 16 Charles Casebolt letter; Job 14:5; Luke 23:43)

## II. Perspective – Hope: Living out the invisible

### A. Positive: Hebrews 6:17 – 20; Psalm 39:7

1. Where as by faith we see the invisible, by hope we laid hold of the invisible, we strike out, accepting invisible realities as more real and determining than the visible.

### B. Negative: Proverbs 22:13; 26:13

1. Contrastingly the man without hope lives in fear of those things which his wrong convictions see, even though they do not exist.
2. ISA 8:12 "You are not to say, 'It is a conspiracy!' In regard to all that this people call a conspiracy, And you are not to fear what they fear or be in dread of it."
  - a. Ministry postponement – College – Retirement
  - b. "Children of pagans are the cannon fodder of modern miss. Movement" – C.C.

# The Traditional Wheel

**Introduction: Acts 2:41 & 42 – The roots of Discipleship as defined by the Wheel**

## A. Key Book - Philippians

## B. The Wheel speaks to experiencing the power of Christ in our daily lives

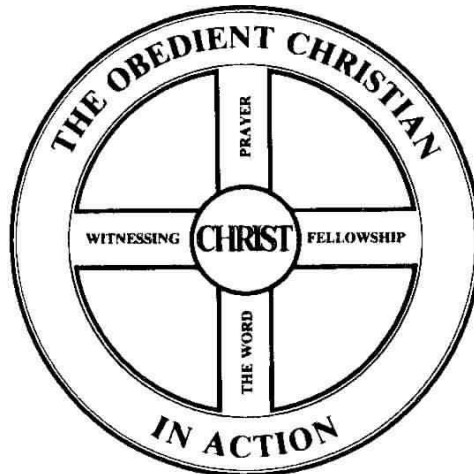
1. Erroneous views of the Wheel
  - a. God the Father and God the Holy Spirit are indifferent to our views concerning God the Son – Jesus Christ.
  - b. Ships Wheel – the wheel as a display, loss of the spiritual principles in favor of cutesy factor
  - c. Table – The wheel apart from Christ the Center, loss of the doctrines of Salvation and Lordship so as not to offend Catholics, Pentecostals and Charismatics. The Wheel was never meant to be a tool for the propagation of disciplines that even Mormon's or Jehovah's Witnesses would be comfortable.)
2. Wagon wheel – hub and rim; the spokes are for power transference
3. Addressed two frustrations that dogged me as young believer
  - a. Being exhorted to do intangibles – crucify the flesh, walk in the spirit, abide in Christ
  - b. Being asked to do things without being told how to do them

**CHRIST THE CENTER** – The Wheel was never meant to exist apart from the doctrines of Salvation and Lordship. It is not generic “spiritual power” through mystical disciplines but the Lordship of Christ that the Wheel teaches: II Corinthians 5:17; Galatians 2:20 (Power Takeoff Unit on tractor gear – ratio connection for add on equipment – bailer, grass cutter, rake, if stripped out then no power transfer.

**THE OBEDIENT DISCIPLE IN ACTION** – The Wheel was never meant to be stand alone spiritual disciplines apart from the concerted and purposeful submission to and obedience to Christ John 14:15, 21, 23, 24; Romans 12:1
