For Further Reflection/Application: *Lord help us to be effectually doers of the Word!*

What biblical doctrines/Scriptural truths does this generation of American unbelievers loathe the most?

Like a master artist, Jesus powerfully contrasts Love and Friendship *with* Hatred and Persecution! Jesus calls His disciples to treat one another as family (note John 15:12-17; 13:34-35). In view of John 15:18-16:6, why is it essential for God's people to love one another in a Christ-like manner?

What are some examples of O.T. saints who were "persecuted for righteousness sake" and/or "hated without cause?" After listening to the sermon today, reread Hebrews 11:1-12:4 this week.

What are some examples of N.T. saints/churches that endured hostility and persecution? The book of Acts is an historical account of how the church expanded from Jerusalem to Rome in 3 decades. How often do you encounter Christian persecution in the book of Acts? What are some different ways the big, bad world persecutes Christians? Note the "progression of persecution" mentioned in today's sermon.

What are some contemporary examples of Christians who suffered because of their biblical values/witness? How have you been mocked/ridiculed/marginalized/attacked because of your Christian faith/values/etc.? When are you tempted to compromise the biblical message or just go with the flow in order to "save face" and/or lessen the chance of being persecuted?

Why shouldn't we be shocked when unrepentant unbelievers target us? (note John 15:18-16:6; 1 Peter 4:12; 2 Timothy 3:12; John 3:19-21)? Why do they hate us? Review your notes from previous sermons, pt. 1 and pt. 2. (a Biblical Theology of Sinful Hatred and Christian Persecution).

Have you ever read any accounts of Christian persecution in "Foxe's Book of Martyrs?" What stories impacted you the most? Read 15-20 pages of this classic church history book this week. You can find free versions of this book online. You can also find a few copies in our church library.

Other accounts of modern-day persecution can be found in the book, "Jesus Freaks: Stories of Those Who Stood for Jesus, the Ultimate Jesus Freaks." Pastor also encouraged us to frequent Open Door's website-https://www.opendoorsusa.org/ and the Voice of the Martyrs website-www.opendoorsusa.org/ and the Voice of the Martyrs website-

A friend of King Jesus' is a friend of mine! Do your actions and words demonstrate that you view your brothers and sisters in Christ as friends and family in the manner you treat them? What are some ways you've experienced Christ-like love here at Lake Country Bible Church. What are some practical ways you can "love one another" (John 15:12-13, 17)? How can prayer be an expression of love? How can ministry service be an expression of love? How can sacrificial giving be an expression of love? How can you show Christ-like love to church family during happy times; (such as engagements/weddings/the birth of children)? How can you show Christ-like love to church family during hard times; (such as funerals; surgeries/cancer treatments; Christian persecution; etc)? Attending someone's wedding from church is a simple way to flesh out John 15:12-13. Rarely are believers asked to sacrifice their life for a Christian friend (John 15:13); but we are given many opportunities to die to self in loving service to one another.

Be encouraged and persevere in the Lord's strength! Note Matthew 5:10-12; 1 Peter 4:7-19; 5:8-12.
