Welcome to Westminster Presbyterian Church. We are grateful to have you join us today, as we offer worship to God through our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

A few notes to help you fully participate:

LITURGICAL RESPONSE: Please note that when the congregation is to read, the type will be **boldfaced and indented**:

[Leader] The Lord be with you!

[Congregation] And also with you!

WORSHIP WITH THE BODY: We have been created as people with bodies and souls. Throughout our worship, besides sitting, we will stand, raise our hands, and even kneel. Please note the * and \S symbols to indicate standing or raising hands.

THE LORD'S SUPPER: Also known as "communion", the Lord's Supper is rite of fellowship between Christ and His people. We invite all who have been initiated into the family of God by baptism, and admitted to table fellowship by the leadership of this or some other church, to join in the communion service by faith. If you haven't been baptized, please speak with the pastor or elders before the service if you would like to come to join in the Holy Supper.

CHILDREN: You will notice many children in our service today. Jesus welcomed little children to Himself, and so we welcome them in our worship service! We understand that this means baby noises and wiggly children, and we're fine with that. If your child is fussy or needs a little time to quiet down, we have a mother's nursery in the side room. We're happy to accommodate your family in any way we can.

TODAY'S WORSHIP: "Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil." This well-known verse comes alive for us as we see that it is the wise person, who dedicates himself to the service of others... something we can do only because the Lord Jesus has dedicated Himself to serving us. Many Scripture readings will focus on Christ's service to us, and the necessity of our service to others. Consider the Large Emden Catechism reading as a summary of all the Scripture's teaching on the subject.

*OLD TESTAMENT READING & SERMON TEXT: ECCLESIASTES 4

Again I saw all the oppressions that are done under the sun. And behold, the tears of the oppressed, and they had no one to comfort them! On the side of their oppressors there was power, and there was no one to comfort them. ² And I thought the dead who are already dead more fortunate than the living who are still alive. ³ But better than both is he who has not yet been and has not seen the evil deeds that are done under the sun.

⁴Then I saw that all toil and all skill in work come from a man's envy of his neighbor. This also is vanity and a striving after wind.

⁵The fool folds his hands and eats his own flesh.

⁶Better is a handful of quietness than two hands full of toil and a striving after wind.

⁷Again, I saw vanity under the sun: ⁸ one person who has no other, either son or brother, yet there is no end to all his toil, and his eyes are never satisfied with riches, so that he never asks, "For whom am I toiling and depriving myself of pleasure?" This also is vanity and an unhappy business.

⁹Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil. ¹⁰For if they fall, one will lift up his fellow. But woe to him who is alone when he falls and has not another to lift him up! ¹¹Again, if two lie together, they keep warm, but how can one keep warm alone? ¹²And though a man might prevail against one who is alone, two will withstand him—a threefold cord is not quickly broken.

¹³Better was a poor and wise youth than an old and foolish king who no longer knew how to take advice. ¹⁴For he went from prison to the throne, though in his own kingdom he had been born poor. ¹⁵I saw all the living who move about under the sun, along with that youth who was to stand in the king's place. ¹⁶There was no end of all the people, all of whom he led. Yet those who come later will not rejoice in him. Surely this also is vanity and a striving after wind.

*NEW TESTAMENT READING: GALATIANS 5:1-15

*GOSPEL READING: MARK 12:28-34

*CONFESSION OF FAITH: THE LARGE EMDEN CATECHISM OF THE STRANGER'S CHURCH (LONDON, 1551).

Q. 116. What are the fruits and the works which the Spirit produces in the faithful?

R. They are varied, but the gifts and fruits of the Spirit, which can never be separated from faith, are all encompassed in love, namely, that we ought to love God above all else and our neighbor as ourselves, with which it happens that we may hold, love, and attend with all our heart to that which pleases God, and serve our neighbor with every act of righteousness.

Q. 117. Must we then be concerned about God and our neighbor to believe aright?

R. Absolutely, for this is the nature of all the sons of God, though some are more zealous in this than others, depending on the amount of the gift given him by the Lord.

We confess that we have stolen. We acknowledge our greed; we admit our love of the world and the things of the world; we have dishonestly gained and kept what we have, and greedily held what belongs to others;

We confess that we have borne false witness, that we have been untrue and unfaithful toward our neighbor, that we have shaded, twisted, and denied the truth;

We confess that we have coveted the possessions and spouses of others; we acknowledge in summary that our whole life is nothing else than sin and transgression of Your holy commandments and an inclination toward all evil.

Therefore, we beg of You, O heavenly Father, that You would graciously forgive us these and all our sins. Keep and preserve us henceforth that we may walk only in Your ways and live according to Your will; through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, our Savior. Amen.



CHILDREN'S LESSON: VALDÉS'S CATECHISM.

Valdés's Catechism was titled Instructions for Children. It was published in 1549, with earlier drafts. The intention is not to have children memorize the statements, but for parents to instruct their children.

4. Let them know that God by his Word created the heavens and the earth, and all that is contained in them (Gen. 1; John 1).

5. Let them know that he, by the same, maintains in their existence all the things he has created, so guiding and governing them all that not a leaf falls from a tree to the ground except by his will (Ps. 37 [Ps. 33]; Heb. 1; Mt. 21).

6. Let them know that God, having created all things, created man as their superior upon earth and placed him in the earthly paradise. He created him in his own image and likeness, inasmuch as man was immortal and impassible and was exceedingly powerful, wise, just, truthful, and faithful (Gen. 2).
