- 3. Shepherds after God's heart are devoted to preaching God's Word (6:4).
 - (1) What is preaching?
 - **(2) Four Greek words helps us understand preaching.** 1. The Greek word translated *preaching* is *kēryssō* = to proclaim; 2. *Shewing the glad tidings* is the Greek word *euangelizō* = to proclaim the good news. 3. *bear witness* is the Greek *martyreō*, which means "to confirm something on the basis of personal knowledge." 4. *teaching* is from the Greek *didaskō*, which means "to provide instruction in a formal or informal setting."
 - **(3) Four characteristics help us define NT preaching.** 1) It is a proclamation of God's word, and especially the gospel of Jesus Christ; 2) It is carried out by recognized leaders with a commission to preach; 3) It is an authoritative proclamation; and 4) It is carried out in a public context.¹
 - (4) What is the difference between preaching and teaching?
 - (5) Pastors according to God's heart must preach for the *conversion* of sinners and the *sanctification* of the saved.
 - (6) Pastors according to God's heart must have unction.
