Sermon: "Destroyed By Lust" Pt. 1- What's Wrong With You People? Pt. 32

I Text:

Old Covenant: *Judges 10:6-9*

New Covenant: *1 John 2:12-17*

II Doctrine:

After fifty five years of stability under Tola and Jair, Israel will fall again into the hands of the world system. Unbridled lust will lead the nation into slow motion destruction.

God almighty does not tolerate his people blaspheming his name. The Lord again uses Israels enemies to discipline the nation. Men were created in God's image and are expected to exert self control, for the glory of God. Over thousands of years the same three schemes are used to destroy men and nations. The lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life destroy a people.

Mystery Babylon is a world system steeped in the lustful worship of everything but the living God. Israel whoring after other pagan gods was an excuse to practice unbridled lust in their lives.

III Comparing Scripture With Scripture:
