- C. Three Kinds of "Insiders" (Professing Christians)
 - 1. **Christians** who do <u>not</u> yet <u>think like</u> <u>Christians</u> (Not Wolves; Disciples)
 - Unbelievers who think they are Christians
 - 3. Unbelievers with hearts full of malice

II. The Lord's Servant

2 Timothy 2:23-24a

Have nothing to do with foolish, ignorant controversies; you know that they breed quarrels. And **the Lord's servant** must <u>not</u> be <u>quarrelsome</u> but <u>kind to everyone...</u>

- A. Not Quarrelsome... but Kind
 - 1. Not becoming "like" the "fool" (Prov. 26:5)
 - 2. "Kind to everyone"
- B. Correcting Opponents (Prov. 26:6)

1. "Patiently enduring evil"

2 Timothy 2:24b-25a

...<u>able to teach</u>, *patiently enduring evil*, ²⁵ correcting his opponents with *gentleness*. ...

"God may perhaps grant them repentance"

2 Timothy 2:25b-26

- ...God may perhaps grant them repentance leading to a knowledge of the truth, ²⁶ and they may come to their senses and escape from the snare of the devil, after being captured by him to do his will.
 - a. Humility (Ephesians 2:1-5)
 - b. Pity "the snare of the devil"
 - c. Hope: "God may perhaps grant them repentance"

III. By their Fruit... You will recognize them

A. By Our Fruit!

Matthew 7:17–27

¹⁷ So, every healthy tree bears good fruit, but the diseased tree bears bad fruit. ¹⁸ A healthy tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a diseased tree bear good fruit. ¹⁹ Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. ²⁰ Thus you will recognize them by their fruits.

21 "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who *does* the will of my Father who is in heaven. ²² On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many mighty works in your name?' ²³ And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness.' ²⁴ "Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. ²⁵ And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did

not fall, because it had been founded on the rock. ²⁶ And everyone who **hears these words of mine** and *does <u>not</u> do them* will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. ²⁷ And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell, and great was the fall of it."

- B. How Should We Approach those who do not Obey the Truth
 - False Teachers
 - a. Beware (Matt. 7:15–20; 2 Peter 2:1)
 - b. Cling to the Scriptures (2 Tim. 3:12–17)
 - c. What about church discipline? (Matthew 18; Matthew 7:6 pearls & Pigs)
 - 2. Approach Doubtful Christians as "Brothers" (Cf. 1 Corinthians 5:9–13)
 - a. Joel Osteen
 - b. Roman Catholics
 - c. Someone who does not understand the gospel... or it's implications
 - d. What about church discipline?
 - 4. Call All People to Worship in Jesus: Anyone with a question might become a brother!
