The change will be:

- A. Instantaneous "In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye"
- B. Indestructible -"the dead will be raised incorruptible"
- C. Immortal "this mortal shall have put on immortality"
- **II.** Champion "the victory through our Lord Jesus" (vs. 54-57)

 The Champion will bring us:
 - A. Victory "Death is swallowed up in victory"
 - **B.** Vitality "The sting of death is sin"
 - *C.* Vindication "the strength of sin is the law"
- III. Consequence "your labor is not in vain in the Lord" (v. 58)

 The consequence of our service being:
- A. Permanent "be ye steadfast"
- B. Persistent "be ye...unmovable"
- C. Potent "be ye ... always abounding"
