Sermon Notes and Daily Devotional First Congregational Church of Woodstock Pastor Doug Warren November 20, 2022

Morning Worship Service:

Philippians 4:21-23

Fellowship of the Saints

1. We Are Part of the Holy Family in Christ Jesus (21-22).

2. How Does Our Gospel Partnership Inform Our Social Graces?

3. May the Grace of the Lord Jesus Christ Truly Be with Our Spirit (23).

CONCLUSION: God closes this letter to the Philippians by passing on greetings within His family. By His grace God has brought these people together, who might even not have known one another at all, to be family together with Christ as their elder brother. The *gospel partnership* they share is the most important thing in their relationship and the source of their joy together. And so they celebrate Christ's grace—His undeserved favor—together. May we, like them, delight together in Jesus, our God, King, and older brother.

First Peter 1:13-21

¹³Therefore, preparing your minds for action, and being sober-minded, set your hope fully on the grace that will be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ. ¹⁴As obedient children, do not be conformed to the passions of your former ignorance, ¹⁵ but as he who called you is **holy**, you also *be holy in all your conduct*, ¹⁶ since it is written, "You shall be holy, for I am holy." ¹⁷And if you call on him as Father who judges impartially according to each one's deeds, *conduct yourselves with fear throughout the time of your exile*, ¹⁸ knowing that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, ¹⁹ but with *the precious blood of Christ*, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot. ²⁰ He was foreknown before the foundation of the world but was made manifest in the last times for the sake of you ²¹ who through him are believers in God, who raised him from the dead and gave him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God.

Ecclesiastes 4:9-12

"Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil. For if they fall, one will lift up his fellow. But woe to him who is alone when he falls and has not another to lift him up! Again, if two lie together, they keep warm, but how can one keep warm alone? And though a man might prevail against one who is alone, two will withstand him—a threefold cord is not quickly broken."

Ephesians 1:3-10

³Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, ⁴ even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. In love ⁵ he predestined us for adoption to himself as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will, ⁶ to the praise of his glorious grace, with which he has blessed us in the Beloved. ⁷ In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace, ⁸ which he lavished upon us, in all wisdom and insight ⁹ making known to us the mystery of his will, according to his purpose, which he set forth in Christ ¹⁰ as a plan for the fullness of time, to unite all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth.

Sunday Morning

READ Philippians 4:21-23; Colossians 3:12-17; First Peter 1:13-21; Ecclesiastes 4:9-12; Ephesians 1:3-10; Psalm 100:1-5. DISCUSS What does it mean to be a saint or holy one? How does one become a saint? How are we supposed to treat other saints? Why? How does faith in Christ enable us to do so? MEDITATE on First Corinthians 3:16-17. PRAY "Jesus, thank You for giving us Your holiness. Enable us to love one another according to Your grace."

Sunday Afternoon

Come for a *Thanksgiving Dinner* at 2:30pm followed by a Praise Service!

Monday

READ **Philippians 4:21-23**; **Colossians 3:12-17**; **Psalm 100:1-5**. DISCUSS How are we to have hearts of compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience? How do we express these growing qualities to one another? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE on **First Corinthians 3:16-17**. PRAY, "Father, make us more like Christ. Enable us to love others as You love us."

Tuesday

READ **Philippians 4:21-23**; **First Peter 1:13-21**; **Psalm 100:1-5**. DISCUSS What is the relationship between hope and holiness? How are you expressing your faith in Christ through the ways you serve brothers and sisters in Christ? SERVE by considering someone else's needs *above your own*! MEDITATE on **First Corinthians 3:16-17**. PRAY, "Jesus, You have been so patient with us. Teach us to be that understanding with one another."

Wednesday

READ **Philippians 4:21-23**; **Ecclesiastes 4:9-12**; **Psalm 100:1-5**. DISCUSS How does Christ's provision of brothers and sisters for us demonstrate His love for us? How are you helping others become more like Christ? SERVE by *caring about someone else* more than yourself! MEDITATE on **First Corinthians 3:16-17**. PRAY, "Lord, fill our hearts with gratitude for Your gracious provision."

Thursday – THANKSGIVING DAY

READ **Philippians 4:21-23**; **Colossians 2:1-7**; **Psalm 100:1-5**. DISCUSS What are you struggling to hold onto instead of giving to God? MEDITATE on **First Corinthians 3:16-17**. EXPRESS your thanksgiving to the Lord. PRAY, "Lord, You give us all that we have. You are forever kind and gracious to Your people. Please receive our humble gratitude and forgive us our presumption."

Friday

READ Philippians 4:21-23; Colossians 3:12-17; First Peter 1:13-21; Ecclesiastes 4:9-12; Ephesians 1:3-10; Psalm 100:1-5. DISCUSS, What have you been learning from these passages? How has God been present with you in His Word this week? What do you need to change as a result? MEDITATE on First Corinthians 3:16-17. PRAY that we at FCCW would *honor Christ in all that we think, say, and do*.

Saturday

PREPARE today for the worship service tomorrow. READ Psalm 2:1-12. Invite others to join you tomorrow for Sunday School at 9:00 and the service @ 10:30. Ask Jesus to help us praise Him as we gather.
