 - G. A few applications (1 Peter 3:7)
- V. Jesus: submitting to God and loving toward us
 - A. The drama of men and women is as old as the world.
 - B. The drama of men and women is about God and the world.
 - C. We as a human race have rebelled: we can never be a bride worthy of God.
 - D. Biblical teaching on men and women is about seeing beyond that struggle to the grace of God in the cross of Jesus Christ.
