The Announcement of the Fall (18:1-3) ~	
Fallen, Fallen is Babylon the Great! (already heard this in 14:8 – from Isaiah 21	:9)
What does her fall look like?  - A dwelling place for  - A haunt for every unclean and detestable creature  - Devoid of anything	
Why has this judgment of desolation come upon her?  - Immorality and  - She is charged with corrupting the whole	

## The Plea to Flee (18:4-8) $\sim$

Then I heard another voice from saying, "Come out of her, my people, lest you take part in her sins, lest you share in her plagues, for her sins are heaped high as heaven, God has remembered her iniquities (18:4)  - Letters to the churches warned against  - Avoid Power-Hungry / Pleasure-seeking / Idolatrous-worshipping cult and culture  - We are to be in the world, but not of the world
Pay Backs: Not twice as much as she deserves, but the (twin) of the crime - God will execute justice
What has been the problem – why the fall / judgment? - Self-Glorification and Self-Indulgence
Mighty is the LORD God who has judged her (18:8) – highlighting the power, might, and holiness of the LORD – not highlighting the woman, beast, or Satan.
The False Lover's Lament (18:9-24) ~
The response to those who participated in her wickedness  - Woe, Woe (repeated chorus): Exclamation of / Anguish / Pain  - In a single hour her judgment has come  - Why do they weep and mourn?  O Not because of the loss of a lover, but because of the loss of
One Hour (echoes Daniel's judgment of King Nebuchadnezzar – Daniel 4)
What is the response in heaven to these judgments upon the earth?  over her, O heaven, and you saints and apostles and prophets, for God has given judgment for you her.
